Village Licenses

2003-2004 Licenses Due

Village licenses are due for renewal July 1. The licenses are valid for one year, July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004.

New licenses will be available on or after June 2.

Vehicle License applications will be mailed to all residents who now have Village vehicle licenses. If you have not received an application by mail, they are available at the Police Station and the Village Hall. Police Station hours are 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday thru Friday, and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday. Village Hall hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday thru Friday.

If you have received a pre-printed form and have changed vehicles, write in the corrected information on that form and submit the corrections. You should not fill out a new form. If you have questions about changes, bring the form to the Police Station or call the Police non-emergency telephone number, 323-2153.

Seniors, age 62 and over:

License fee for passenger cars, motorcycles, motorized pedicycles and Class B trucks is one-half the above fee schedule.

Licenses not obtained within 30 days of the due date carry a 50% penalty fee.

Licenses for new vehicles acquired after January 1, 2004, as well as licenses for new residents after January 1, 2004, will be half the full year fee.

A hint—to remove the old vehicle sticker heat with a blow dryer for 1 to 2 minutes, then peel it off cleanly.

Dog and Cat Licenses

You must purchase licenses at the Police Station or Village Hall for all dogs and cats over six months old. Licenses for 2003-2004 run from July 1, 2003 to June 30, 2004. The fee is \$10.00 for each animal. Bring a current certificate of rabies inoculation when you apply.

Attach both the village license and the rabies tag to a collar worn by the dog or cat. You may not have more than three dogs, four cats or a mixture of four dogs and cats. A litter may be kept four months after birth.

Proposed New Countywide Floodplain Map

Public Meetings in June

DuPage County and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) have prepared a preliminary Flood Insurance Study (FIS) and Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) for the entire county. The previous paper maps were prepared on an individual municipal basis in 1980, using outdated technology and municipal boundaries. By joint agreement with FEMA, DuPage County prepared a new countywide computer model, using more recent detailed studies, such as the one prepared a few years ago for the Flagg Creek watershed.

Areas that would be designated as part of the regulatory floodplain in the Village of Clarendon Hills appear to be as follows:

- Park Avenue detention basin and adjoining areas north of Park Avenue and north of Colfax Avenue
- Blue Lake, south of Burlington and Woodstock Avenues
- Grant Avenue south of Harris Avenue
- Holmes Avenue, south of Harris Avenue
- Ditch along Route 83, south of 56th Street

In addition, existing flood plain designations would be revised for Flagg Creek, along Eastern and Harris Avenue from Park Avenue to Route 83.

DuPage County will hold public meetings on Wednesday, June 4, 2003, from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. at the Oak Brook Village Hall, 1200 Oak Brook Road, in Oak Brook, and Thursday, June 5, 2003, from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. at the cafeteria in the DuPage County Government Complex, 421 N. County Farm Road, Wheaton. DuPage County will receive public comments on the proposed maps prior to their adoption by FEMA in coming months. The preliminary FIRM maps will be available for review at the DuPage County Department of Development and Environmental Concerns website located at <http://ec.dupageco.org/dec/floodmaps.html> and on the Village web site (local maps only).

Chicago Avenue Update

Construction Delayed

The Village has received preliminary information on the schedule for reconstruction of Chicago Avenue. As a result of delays in design of the reconstruction, the project will be postponed one year. This means that the utility relocation will occur in mid to late 2004 and road construction will occur in 2005. Watch for future editions of Trustee Topics, which will provide more information about this important project.

55th Street Update

First Phase This Summer

An update has been received from DuPage County on the first phase (Project A) of reconstruction of 55th Street. According to the County Engineer, Project A, will be bid in late June and construction should begin in late July. Project A extends from the Rt. 83 bridge through the Holmes Avenue intersection.

At this time, the County has not provided any updates regarding "Project B", which is the second phase of the construction that includes Holmes Avenue to the western Village limits. The Village will apprise residents of any updates as they develop.

Lions Club Donations

Always Generous

At the April 21st Village Board meeting, Lions Club Foundation President, Ulysses Backas, presented two checks to the Village Board. The first check, \$1,500, was presented to the Village to assist with reforestation of parkway trees within the Village. The money comes from the proceeds of Christmas tree sales by the Lions Club. Over the years the Lions Club has donated over \$75,000 to the Village for parkway trees.

The Lions Club Foundation also presented a check for \$3,305 in memory of Bill Kolleck. Bill, who passed away in March, 2002, was a member of the Village Board of Trustees and a member of the Lions Club. The check represented donations made to the Lions Club at the request of the Kolleck family. The Village Board and the Lions Club will work together to design a memorial with the donations.

The Village would like to thank the Lions Club and Foundation for their continued support.
