Dear Neighbors,

As fall wanes and winter approaches, it looks like we are going to experience another wave of coronavirus and the associated economic impacts. Continue to wear masks and follow the public health guidelines to try to limit the spread of the virus. Also, please do not forget about our local businesses. When you do your Christmas shopping think first of our retail shops downtown like Vintage Charm, Clarendon Hills Hardware, Hallmark Store, Learning Express, Amazing Grace, I Want Candy, and The English Garden. I know it's easy to just hit the "buy now" button on Amazon, but a healthy business district in our town is a huge asset and a big reason people choose to live in Clarendon Hills. Out of every dollar spent locally, 68 cents ends up staying local, compared to less than 48 cents for a big box retailer and even lower for internet retail. In addition, remember with our restaurants, "al fresco" dining will keep going as long as it's feasible, but ultimately restaurants are going to need carryout and delivery orders to keep the lights on.

Downtown Revitalization Project

A note from our Community Development Director Dan Ungerleider, AICP

From my office window, I see so much progress, thanks to the hard work of community volunteers, hard-working contractors and consultants supporting the Village's Downtown Revitalization Project. The Golf and Burlington Avenue intersection has been reconfigured with stop signs, short cross-walks, and a new kiss-and-ride waiting area. The Village Hall front lawn has been expanded and landscaped with sturdy, native landscaping. Bioswales have been installed on both sides of Burlington Avenue. New dark-sky friendly lighting has been installed on both sides of the BNSF railroad tracks. Underground utilities and stormwater structures have been installed south of the tracks, topped with concrete and steel commuter shelters-in-the-making. The commuter parking lot has been reconstructed and reconfigured. And, BNSF has begun to install a new gate crossing system at the Prospect Avenue Crossing.

What's next? On November 11th, the Village will be rededicating its WWII Memorial and Flag Pole in front of Village Hall. Between now and December, the inbound train station and the streetscape work in front of Village Hall will be completed. The South lot will once again be open for commuter parking. And most of the Prospect Avenue gate improvements will be completed. Next spring, the construction of a new outbound station across from Village Hall and installation of a new watermain on Ann Street, north of Park Avenue, will begin.

The Police Department is accepting worn out strings of holiday lights and extension cords starting November 23rd until February 1st, 2021. You can find the collection bin in the lobby of the Police Department located at 448 Park Avenue.

This program is part of the Elgin Recycling program. This is their 12th year of running a holiday light recycling program along with 51 Villages. Last year, the *Village of Clarendon Hills collected 988 lbs of holiday lights!* Elgin Recycling recycled a total of 91,484 lbs of holiday lights that would have otherwise ended up in landfills. Garbage Pickup Procedures




We are reminding residents that garbage cans should be placed at the end of your driveway and not on the street which includes the concrete ribbons. This makes it easier and safer for our crews to clear the streets of snow and allows cars to go around garbage trucks picking up cans.

Leaf Pickup

Free Leaf pickup will continue for the month of November. **Leaves only** in yard waste cans or paper yard waste bags may be placed out on Tuesdays with your other garbage without a sticker. Other yard waste (grass clippings, sticks, weeds, etc.) must have a sticker. Yard waste stickers are \$2.75 each. Stickers are sold at Village Hall, Clarendon Hills Hardware and Jewel on 55th.
