Subject: Weekly Report

- **COVID-19 Business Operation Update** – Businesses continue to operate as reported before. Though not COVID related, we will continue to see various closures of sidewalks and parking areas due to construction/renovation projects throughout the downtown area.
- **Staff Response to COVID-19 Pandemic/Village Operations** – Staff operations are continuing to operate well. No changes from recent reports. I did send out a notice to employees urging those who have not been vaccinated to do so.
- **COVID-19 Health Department Update** – I attended the weekly review meeting on Monday. Things continue to look bad in terms of the spread of COVID-19. Number of cases are continuing to rise, though there is some sign that this is beginning to flatten. Hospitalizations, however, are continuing to go up with the number of COVID patients in the hospital rising above 225 (190 last week). This number was closer to 130 earlier in the month. On a more positive note, As of April 12, 28.48% of DuPage residents were fully vaccinated, compared to 24.03% the week before. More than 397,000 have received a “first dose” of the vaccine, about 41,000 in the last week. This suggests that something close to that number will be fully vaccinated in about one month. Almost 44,000 doses were distributed to the County this week, which will go a long way to making the vaccine available for all adults that want it. About 86% of persons 65+ in DuPage County have received at least the first dose, which is about 2% higher than last week.
- **Du-Comm Board of Directors Meeting** – I participated in this meeting on Tuesday morning. Routine business was conducted.
- **DMMC Business Meeting** – On Wednesday morning, I participated in the regular business meeting. Routine business was conducted.
- **Chamber Meeting** – I also participated, along with other Village staff, in this meeting on Wednesday morning. Various items were discussed including business support opportunities, summer events and the various downtown construction projects taking place.

- **Metro Manager's Training Event** – I participated in this event on Wednesday afternoon. The discussion was in regard to Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) practices being followed by various communities in the region.
- **Bigbelly Cans Installed** -- The new Bigbelly cans were installed this week in front of Domino's and The Daily Scoop. The solar compacting cans are able to hold up to 5 times as much refuse as a standard can.
- **Refuse Update** - Can swaps for any late decision makers were performed this week. Overall, it appears the transition is mostly complete.

1. Vehicle Stickers will be available for purchase on May 1st. Residents will receive a vehicle sticker application with purchase instructions in the mail on or near April 29th. Residents can make online purchases at www.clarendonhills.us/388/Online-Bill-Pay, or the link can be accessed by visiting the Village Website and clicking "Online Bill Pay" or "How do I," and a link to the site will be available.

Prices are as follows:

Passenger Car- \$40
Motorcycle- \$30
Seniors (62+) are eligible for a 50% discount.

Village of Clarendon Hills residents will have the option to purchase a special vehicle sticker showing their support for Dancin' in the Street Summer Concert Series by donating a minimum of \$10.00 (plus regular sticker price).

Residents are required to purchase a village sticker for each vehicle they will have housed in Clarendon Hills. The annual license period begins July 1st of each year and ends on June 30th of the following year.

My report is short since I was out of the office for most of the week.

1. **Building Permits.** So far in April, the Village issued twenty-three (23) permits, having a total reported construction value of \$763,591.
2. **Downtown Revitalization Project** [[link](#)]
 - a. **Train Station – Inbound Shelters.** This week the contractor focused on light fixture installation. If weather permits, the contractor plans to begin applying a concrete graffiti coating, and other painting finishes next week. Topsoil and landscaping are also on track to begin later this month.
 - b. **Train Station – Outbound Shelter.** The new shelter's foundation and underground structures have substantially been constructed. Foundation framing and concrete is on schedule for next week. Please be aware of your surroundings if you are walking or driving around the construction site. For your safety, please use the sidewalks on the north side of Burlington Ave and west side of S Prospect Ave. Thank you.
 - c. **Streetscape.** Village Hall railings are installed. Other punch list items will be completed later this Spring.
 - d. **Gates.** Exit gates are expected to be installed in late 2021 or early 2022.
 - e. **Burlington Plaza/Alley.** On April 5, 2021, the Village Board approved and directed staff to develop construction plans for Burlington Plaza at Burlington Avenue and Prospect Avenue's southwest corner. Staff is working with architectural and engineering design consultant to prepare the bid documents for the project. Construction of the Plaza and reconstruction of the alley is planned for summer 2021.
