### Recent Training and Meetings

### Recent events:

On August 28, 4:05pm, officers spoke with a complainant at the station regarding a theft of mislaid property. The complainant, while checking out at the Jewel Foods, left her wallet on the counter. Several minutes later, an Asian or Hispanic male took the wallet after checking out. Pending.

On August 28, 7:16pm, officers responded to the business district for a subject suffering a mental health crisis. The subject was transported for evaluation.

On August 29, 12:30am, officers stopped a motorist on Chicago Ave. for having a suspended registration. During the stop, officers determined that the occupants were juveniles out after curfew. The driver was cited and the juveniles were released to their parents.

On August 29, 7:25am, officer responded to the Notre Dame Church parking lot for an in-progress burglary to a motor vehicle. The offenders fled in two stolen vehicles after several residents interrupted them. Pending.

On August 30, 2:16pm, officers were dispatched to the area of Prospect and Sheridan for a suspicious person entering people's backyards and asking for money. After locating the subject, officers determined no crime had occurred. The subject was given a ride to the depot.

On September 2, 5:00am, officers were called to assist Downers Grove Pd set a perimeter at a burglary scene.
