- **Next Board Meeting** – The next meeting is on Tuesday, January 19th at 6:30 p.m. and again we will offer a virtual option. It is on Tuesday due to the MLK Holiday on the Monday before.
- **COVID Update** – I participated in a meeting with the DuPage County Health Department on Monday. They of course confirmed the continued spread of the new COVID variant. Cases in Clarendon Hills appear to be trending down, at least a little, as of the end of this week. District 86 has confirmed they are hosting another vaccine event on January 24, open to the eligible public (over 12 years old). The Village has posted information regarding this event on our Facebook page.
- **Public Safety Committee Meeting** – The Committee met on Wednesday evening at 6:30 to discuss the update on Fire Department vehicles. The Committee conducted a discussion on the various issues and concluded with a recommendation that talks with neighboring communities proceed. No formal action is recommended at this time.

- Salting occurred on Saturday afternoon and again on Saturday night to address the freezing rain.
- Salting at the train station occurred early Monday morning as the platform had some slick spots.
- Crews repaired a main break on Indian north of Norfolk on Tuesday afternoon.
- On Wednesday crews took down the 73 Christmas Wreaths and light pole garland in the Downtown. They also removed the Christmas Trees that were throughout the Downtown.
- On Wednesday night, crews repaired a water main break on the rear yard main between Iroquois and Hiawatha.
- Thursday night, crews were called in to address glitches emanating from a third-party software update which then triggered our water system monitoring software to go into alert mode.
- Annual training and certification to work in the Burlington Northern Right of Way took place this week.
- Training on safe operation of the end loader also took place this week.

1. **401 55th Street – ZBA/PC review**

A ZBA/PC public hearing was scheduled for January 20, 2022 to review a conditional use request as part of a planned redevelopment of 401 55th Street. After comments from applicable jurisdictions, the applicant postponed the request to address the various substantive comments regarding the proposal. The project may return for formal public hearing in the near future. All required public notice will be conducted as outlined delineated in the zoning code.

2. **English Garden renovation at 14 S. Prospect Ave**

Permits are being readied for issuance for the interior remodel upgrading of the first and second floors of the building to accommodate the move of this valuable business within the downtown.

3. **Il Mio restaurant – 30 S. Prospect Ave.**

Il Mio has opened and appears to be a good addition to the Clarendon Hills community as business so far has been brisk.

Recent events:

On January 8, 9:00am, officers responded to a residence on Commons for a domestic dispute. Officers offered advice.

On January 8, 2:30pm, officers responded to the 500 block of Chase for a neighbor dispute. A resident of the apartment complex was using her cell phone to video an illegally parked car. The owner of the car saw this, and an argument ensued. The argument culminated in a wrestling match for the phone. The offender was taken into custody and charged with battery.

On January 9, 1:15am, officers stopped to assist a motorist on Rte. 83. The driver had crashed his car and was trying to change the tire. It turns out that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. He was cited and bonded out.

On January 10, 9:09pm, officers stopped a Chicago resident for speeding on Ogden Ave. During the stop, officers discovered the driver had open cannabis in the passenger compartment. While searching the vehicle, officers located a loaded 9mm pistol under the driver's seat. The driver was placed into custody and charged with aggravated unlawful use of weapon, possession of cannabis by driver, and other traffic offenses. He was transported to DuPage County Jail.

On January 12, 11:28am, officers spoke with a resident regarding an identity theft. The victim advised that she clicked on an email link that she thought was from her accountant. Soon after, the victim was alerted about fraudulent account activity. Pending.

On January 12, 8:05pm, officers stopped a Willowbrook resident for speeding on 55th Street. The driver also had a suspended driver's license. He was taken into custody and his car was administratively towed. The driver posted bond at the station.

On January 13, 1:00pm, officers responded to an apartment at 285 N. Richmond for a domestic battery. Officers are in the process of obtaining an arrest warrant for the offender.
