1. Crews removed and replaced a storm basin on Railroad.
2. Meter reading was accomplished for the billing cycle this month.
3. Multiple JULIE locates, water meter change outs and meter reading system repairs were completed.
4. An IEPA water sample collector visited the emergency well #6 at Holmes and 55th to collect samples from the well to determine what is in the water aquifer in the Great Lakes region. This type of sampling occurs every other year, the information is charted by the IEPA.
5. Landscaping and road edging repairs continued throughout the Village.
6. The extensive rains had crews cleaning storm inlets and clearing water ways throughout the Villages storm system. There were no significant flooding issues.
7. Maintenance and oil changes were performed on two of the Public Works Vehicles and four of the Police Departments vehicles this week.
8. Minor storm damaged was addressed along with some hanging tree branches.
9. Hauling of ground spoils and tree debris to dump sites were also accomplished this week.

1. Fire Prevention Bureau Activity.
 - This week Lt. Godek has followed up several construction projects in the village to make sure they are on track.
2. Training Report:
 - Daily on duty training sessions were conducted.
 - Wednesday evening twenty-one (21) Firefighters attended training. This training session was the training on some new hose loads on Engine 86 and Ladder 86.
 - The fire department is planning to conduct some live smoke/rescue training at a house located at 410 Naperville Road on Wednesday evening May 11th. If any village board members are interested in observing and/or participating in this training, please contact me and we can arrange this.
3. COVID 19 Report:
 - There were no COVID 19 Hospitalizations reported at both Hinsdale and LaGrange Hospitals.
 - EMS personnel continue to take full PPE precautions during all EMS calls.
4. Emergency Medical Services Report:
 - No report.
 - We are working jointly with the Hinsdale Fire Department and Andres Medical Billing to revise and bring up to date our EMS billing amounts and billing practices to increase revenues in 2023.
5. Clarendon Hills/Hinsdale FD sharing of services report:
 - I have begun to work on a revised sharing or services/Automatic Aid Agreement with Hinsdale.
 - I am also working on an Automatic Aid Agreement with the Village of Westmont.
6. Emergency Management Report:
 - The three (3) severe weather warning sirens were activated by Du-Comm on Saturday, April 30th at 4:55 PM following a report of a funnel cloud reported in the Oak Brook area.
7. Du-Comm Report:
 - On Wednesday morning, May 4th I attended the virtual meeting of the Du-Comm Support Services Committee. With the resignation of Du-Comm Executive Director Brian Tegtmeyer, Mr. Bill Balling was introduced as the acting director. Bill Balling also served as Interim Village Manager in Clarendon Hills in 2011.

 - All vehicles are in full service.
