I want to start by thanking the Chamber of Commerce for all of their work throughout the year to get events restarted in our community. The 65th Annual Christmas Walk was by far the best one that I have been to and I was very excited to see our downtown packed with people in all the new businesses. The Witches Ride and SantaCon were also unique events started by residents that were fun for participants while getting people downtown. I am excited to see what everyone comes up with next year.

For 2022, I am proud to announce that many of our property owners should see a small decrease in the Village portion of their property taxes. We passed a budget with only a 1% property tax increase, which is below the expected increase in property value from new construction. Those newly constructed properties' tax bills more than offset the increase in the overall Village tax levy. This represents the culmination of many, many cost saving efforts our Village staff and Board have found over the years including staff reductions, restructuring departments, employee benefit changes, vendor changes and technology improvements. Over the last decade, the Village has decreased fulltime staff by 12% even as the population has grown 14%. These cuts were made without a fundamental change in services. In fact, service quality improved by providing better communications, allowing residents to do most everything online, more support for events, increased our on-duty fire personnel and through capital improvements such as the train station, storm water improvements and new concrete ribbons. Moving forward, increasing economic development, and growing the tax base should help to further shift the tax burden off of homeowners. I am thrilled to see continued progress on those fronts.

As we approach snowy season, I want to thank our public works crews who do a fantastic job of keeping the streets safe for us. I also want to remind everyone to eat and shop local.

Reducing Complexity and Improving Transparency

The Village recently removed the costly complexity from the permitting process. For many decades the Village required cash deposits accompany permit applications and permit issuance. Although these deposits were refundable, they could be a significant cash expenditure creating undue carrying costs. In addition to this imposition on the private community members, these permit and construction deposits became more hassle than an advantage, so the Village Administration and the Village Board agreed to remove these overly bureaucratic portions of the permitting process to streamline the efficient and safe improvement to the Village's houses and businesses.

Reassurance Program

The Clarendon Hills Police Department offers a "Reassurance Program" for residents who need a daily health and/or safety check. Participants, once enrolled, are required to call the non-emergency dispatch number daily between 6am-10am to the Clarendon Hills Police Department at (630) 323-2151.

Active participants in the program whom do not contact the Clarendon Hills Dispatch by 10:00 am will be called by the Police Department. If no response is forthcoming, an officer is dispatched to the person's residence for a wellness check. Persons eligible to participate in this program must be a Clarendon Hills resident, complete an application, supply a key to the residence (*to be kept at the Police Department*), as well as a recent picture of the applicant. All of these are required to begin this service.

The program is not limited to any one category of persons. The program is available to any person, subject to the requirements discussed above, claiming a need for this service; i.e. senior citizen, handicapped, bed ridden, etc.

The information provided on the application is kept confidential.

Christmas Clean Up

Lakeshore Recycling Services (LRS) offers free recycling for Christmas Trees during the month of January. All decorations must be removed. Place trees only for recycling at the curb.



Winter Reminders



Residents are required to park off the Village streets if the weather predicts 2 or more inches of snow fall. This is to allow for proper snow removal. *(It's recommended snow be removed from the top of your vehicle prior to driving!)*

No person shall dump snow onto any public road, public sidewalk or fire hydrant. Snow should be removed within 3 feet of fire hydrants.

Garbage cans should be placed at the end of your driveway and not on the street which includes the concrete ribbons. This makes it easier and safer for our crews to clear the streets of snow and allows cars to go around garbage trucks picking up cans.
