Message from the President

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

The Village continues to bloom with the native and annual plantings in the garden beds downtown. We love the feedback on how beautiful the added floral and greenery contributes to the ambiance of the Village. Since the last issue, we have wrapped up a successful events season including the Dancin' in the Street concert series, Daisy Days and Daisy Dash. We had some huge crowds at these events that by some estimates set records. Local businesses were also enjoying the impact with increased sales throughout the season.

The Farmer's Market continues every Thursday until October 20th. Additionally, the Chamber and our local businesses are planning even more events in the downtown. We look forward to an Oktoberfest on September 17th, hosted by local businesses in the downtown including the Open Door Taproom & Bottleshop. In October, the Witches Ride continues and will take place along with the annual Halloween Walk being held October 29th. This is a culmination of efforts by local volunteers, the new Chamber Director position funded by the Village, our local business community and village staff. I look forward to even more fun, family friendly events that make our town an attractive place to live.

In the face of near record inflation, the Village continues to look for ways to save residents money while keeping services at a high level. Budget season has started in the Village and at the instruction of the Village Board, the starting point is a 2% increase in the property taxes. Given new construction in the Village, a typical homeowner may only see a 1% increase, or less, on their Village portion of the bill. We were able to do this while increasing police staffing, continuing the staffing enhancement in the fire department that started in 2020 and purchasing a new fire apparatus for the department. The biggest factor in keeping taxes down is strict fiscal discipline and continued growth in our business community. Please continue to support all the businesses in Clarendon Hills. Our businesses are geographically spread out from the downtown district along the tracks as well as Ogden Avenue and 55th Street. Something as simple as shopping at the Clarendon Hills Jewel-Osco instead of the Westmont Jewel-Osco can mean hundreds of dollars a year difference in local revenues.

As we approach election season, there is one issue that will be on the ballot in November that was initiated by the Village Board. As our current long time Village Clerk Dawn Tandle, has decided not to run for election again, we are considering whether to make this elected local clerk position into an appointed position. In this issue of Trustee Topics, there are some facts to guide you in your decision. Please take time to consider the vote on this when you head to the polls November 6th.

REFERENDUM ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT

At the July 18, 2022 Board meeting, staff was directed to proceed with a referendum to convert the Village Clerk position into an appointed rather than an elected position. This would take effect at the end of the current elected term in May 2023. Dawn Tandle, the current long term serving Village Clerk, has advised that she does not intend to run for election in 2023 for another term. The proposed question will be on the November 2022 ballot.

The Village determined that the duties could be absorbed by current staff members and/or minor contractual spending with a projected savings to Village residents. The Village currently employs an Executive Assistant that acts a Deputy Clerk in order to fulfil some of the duties of the position in the Clerk's absence. Unlike other paid positions within the Village, Illinois State Statute requires a referendum be approved to allow for the position to be appointed and to distribute the statutory duties of the position among staff. The Village Clerk would be appointed by the Village President with the advice and consent of the Village Board if the referendum is approved.

The proposed question will be on the November 2022 ballot.

Shall the Village Clerk of the Village of Clarendon Hills be appointed by the President, with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees, rather than be elected?

**No Regrets When You
DRIVE WITH CARE**

- Slow down near bus stops and watch out for kids.
- Red flashing lights and an extended stop arm means the school bus has stopped to load or unload children.
- On a two-lane road or a divided roadway with no median, all drivers in both directions must stop.
- Obey the traffic laws, signals and speed limits.

When a bus is traveling on a four-lane roadway (example 55th Street) with two lanes traveling in the opposite direction, only those lanes of traffic traveling in the same direction as the school bus must stop. Pupils are not required to cross 4 or more lanes of traffic.

CLARENDON HILLS ELECTRONIC WASTE COLLECTION



Please note that the Clarendon Hills residents will be allowed to place accepted electronic waste items at their curb for collection by LRS if they call **844.NEED.LRS** or submit a request at <https://LRSrecycles.com/ewaste>. Residents who don't request and/or enroll for this service may not have items collected. When residents enroll, they are required to list the items for pick-up.

Date of collection is **October 24, 2022**.

This event will take place for **one day only**, and you **must enroll**.
Enrollment deadline is October 19th.

ALLOWABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:

TV's, printers, computers, computer monitors, laptops, gaming consoles, fax machines, scanners, stereo equipment, cell phones, keyboards/mice, extension cords, telephones, cameras, network cables, computer cords.

SMALL HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES:

Blenders, microwaves, toasters, alarm clocks, hair dryers (most small corded items).

NOT ACCEPTED:

Electronics containing liquids/hazardous materials (these items include air conditioners, refrigerators, dehumidifiers, etc.), batteries for cars, boats, sump pumps, etc., smoke detectors, thermostats, lightbulbs, gas-powered items.

If an allowable item is too large to handle, or needs special consideration, LRS may not be able to take it, or reschedule for a different day.
