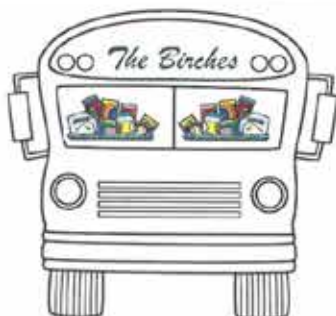

## MEMORANDUM

**Subject:** Weekly Report

1. This week had us focused on decorating the Village for the Holidays. Wreaths went up and poles were wrapped with garland. 38 trees were installed for the Chamber of Commerce. The village tree was decorated. String lights were installed in the Downtown.
2. A coordination meeting was held with the Chamber of Commerce to work out logistics for the Holiday Walk.
3. Additional concrete was poured at the environmental cleanup site on Eastern.
4. Concrete was poured at the train station as a temporary measure until new heat elements can be installed next Spring.
5. Planter beds throughout the Village had their Fall cleanup completed.
6. Road patching will occur on Monday and Tuesday next week in a number of locations across the Village. All patches are expected to have pavement removed and replaced in the same day.
