Message from the President

Dear Neighbors,

I'm proud to say that 2022 was a great year in the Village. Finishing the Downtown Revitalization project is something we can all be proud of! New challenges face us now with economic headwinds like inflation and labor shortages but our Village is in strong financial shape. We have seen a growing tax base, high levels of real estate investment, quality infrastructure investment and new businesses opening throughout the year. Even as the economy slows, the Village is in a great position to weather any short-term economic softness and continues to provide a high level of service to the residents of Clarendon Hills. The Village Board and staff are confident in the fiscal strength of the Village and just passed a budget with a property tax level increase of only 2%, which given the growth in property values and new construction will be less than 1% for most homeowners. This is very significant in that we could have levied up to 5% but continued our conservative approach to taxing and budget control. Although the Village tax is a small portion of your property tax bill, given the record inflation everyone is experiencing, every bit helps. I will stress again that the biggest factors driving our success in 2022 are the growth of our small business community and a tight control on spending.



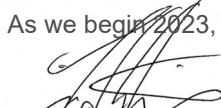

DOWNTOWN IMPROVEMENTS AND VITALITY

The English Garden flower shop moved to 10-14 S. Prospect in November of 2022. The owners have done a great job of restoring the beauty of the original building and bringing the building up to the current building codes. This building should last another 100 years.



Mycroft Row is another beautiful addition to the Village located at 225 Burlington. Within walking distance to the Metra train and the downtown, this finished project has six row houses, each being between 2,750-2,850 sq. feet, and having 3 bedrooms, 3.5 baths, spacious open concept living space and kitchen, terrace, attached 2-car garage and an in-unit elevator. Ground level office spaces from 400 to 2,400 sq. feet with private parking available. New businesses are already moving into this location.

We are excited to welcome two new businesses to the Village. Please check them out, as they are expected to be opening soon!

La pearl, which will offer bubble tea (*a Taiwanese cold drink made with tea, sweetened milk or other flavorings, and balls of tapioca*) at 29 S. Prospect and Wasabi Restaurant and Bar which will offer fish for sushi that is as fresh as possible, yakitori, which is a style of Japanese barbecue; a fully-stocked bar, with craft beers at 31 S. Prospect.

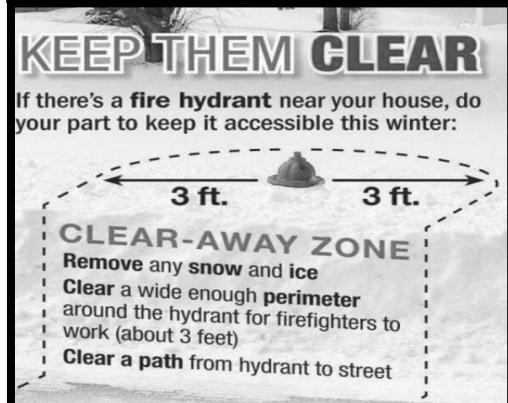

Our Zoning Code

Our Zoning Code is an important part of our community's past, present and future. Culminating in 2019, the Village modernized the Zoning Regulations (Chapter 20 of the Municipal Code). This was overall a good process and result, but as often happens with such extensive efforts, improvements and changes become evident once we began using the code. Therefore in 2021 and 2022, a variety of parts and portions of the code, such as fence regulations, permitted use table, permitted encroachments, group homes and single-family residential use standards have been reviewed and approved by staff, the Zoning Board of Appeals/Plan Commission and, ultimately, the Village Board.

Christmas Clean Up

Lakeshore Recycling Services (LRS) offers free recycling for Christmas Trees during the month of January. All decorations must be removed. Place trees only for recycling at the curb.



Winter Reminders



Residents are required to park off the Village streets if the weather predicts 2 or more inches of snow fall. This is to allow for proper snow removal. (*It's recommended snow be removed from the top of your vehicle prior to driving!*)

No person shall dump snow onto any public road, public sidewalk or fire hydrant. Snow should be removed within 3 feet of fire hydrants.

Garbage cans should be placed at the end of your driveway and not on the street which includes the concrete ribbons. This makes it easier and safer for our crews to clear the streets of snow and allows cars to go around garbage trucks picking up cans.
