- **Next Board Meeting** – The next meeting is on Monday, June 5th at 6:30 p.m. A virtual option will NOT be available for elected officials. This Meeting will be the first full meeting with the new Village Board.
- **June 20th Board Meeting** – As a reminder, the second meeting in June is scheduled for TUESDAY, June 20th instead of June 19th. This is due to the Juneteenth Holiday.

1. BNSF RR continued work on the Cass Avenue crossing in Westmont. The official detour is to Fairview in Downers Grove, but additional traffic is occurring on Prospect. This work is expected to be completed next week.
2. Mauro Construction worked on concrete and asphalt patching this week. The patches are temporary as Burlington is slated for repaving later this Summer.
3. The DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference increased our grant funding to allow for higher bid amounts that occurred with IDOT's bidding of Burlington Avenue. Construction costs will be split with the Federal share being 80% and the local share being 20%.
4. Annuals were planted at the Downtown Triangle and Harris landscape island.
5. New plants were watered in the Downtown planters. Additional watering was completed on newly seeded areas. Mowing took place throughout the Village. Additional repairs were performed on tire ruts on affected parkways.
6. Crews began weeding the different Downtown planting beds this week. A contractor has been secured to maintain the native plant beds on a monthly basis throughout the growing season.
7. A number of JULIE locates, new meter installs, water disconnects, and reinstall inspections were performed, and other work requests were completed.

1. **Fiber Installation Method-** Attended a meeting with Village Manager Barr and the Village of Western Springs representatives to learn more about a less invasive method of trenching fiber, within the roadway footprint and without directional boring.
2. **American Planning Webinar-** Attended a virtual planning webinar on the increase in demand for multi-family projects and the planning elements of their aesthetic designs.
3. **401 55th Street-** Talked with a real estate broker about some options for redeveloping this key commercial property.
4. **Meeting with Residents-** Met with various residents concerning; sports courts, impervious lot coverage, drainage and stormwater management improvements to single-family properties.
5. **Annexation Project South of 55th Street-** With the pre-annexation agreements due to expire in the next year or so, staff has initiated the discussions with the City Attorney to voluntary annex these properties.
6. **ZBA Case-** The ZBA has a variance case scheduled for June for a single-family residential addition. The legal notice was published and notified, per the code requirements.

 - On Tuesday May 23rd, CHFD on duty personnel attended joint training sessions with the Hinsdale Fire Department at the east Lions Pool parking lot.
 - Later in late May and early June, Clarendon Hills on duty members will be doing joint training at Advent Hinsdale Hospital over three (3) different days.
 - On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of this week, Clarendon Hills on duty personnel attended joint training with the Tri State Fire Protection District at the 15-story high rise building located at 6340 Americans Drive in Willowbrook.
 - Clarendon Hills hosted the MABAS Division 10 Hazardous Materials training drill on Saturday, May 20, 2023, at the Clarendon Hills Public Works Facility.
 - Wednesday evening, seventeen (17) Clarendon Hills Firefighters attended weekly evening training. Pumping and hose relays were performed several times.
