1. **20 Oxford:** A single-family residential permit was recently issued for 20 Oxford. Recently, the excavator had started to dig out the site for the foundation and backfill. The unprotected excavated wall to the south has experienced some significant movement, with all the recent rain. I met with the resident to the south, at their request, and brokered the agreed upon resolution with the builder, to shore up the walls of the excavation. Both parties insurance companies are now involved and the builder is moving forward to shore up the site asap, pour the foundations and backfill with excavation.
2. **ZBA/PC Meeting:** A ZBA/PC meeting is scheduled for 7/20/2023. On the agenda is a plat of consolidation for 242 Powell Street. The owner of 242 Powell Street purchased the property next door and plans to demolish the neighboring residence and build an addition to their existing residence. The plat of consolidation will come to the Village Board after the ZBA/PC has made their recommendation.
3. **PUD Application:** A PUD application has been submitted by Lettuce Sustain Us Farms, LLC to utilize two shipping containers to grow lettuce and vegetables at Lions Park/Kubat Pool. This item will go before the ZBA/PC at their regular meeting in August and possibly the Village Board in September.
4. **104 Walker/Kopecka Property:** The Village Manager and myself had a very productive virtual meeting this week with a prospective developer for 104 Walker. The initial concept is a mixed-use development with potential for a restaurant type user on the first floor. Further information on this important property will be shared when it is forthcoming.

1. Fire Prevention Bureau Activity.
 - In the last four (4) weeks Lt. Godek has been very busy with Fire Prevention/Life Safety Inspections and many other issues related to fire alarms, development projects, etc.
2. Training Report:
 - Regular evening training was conducted on Tuesday, June 20th and June 27th.
 - During the past month, nine (9) mutual aid training sessions were conducted with the Hinsdale Fire Department. Pump training, Hinsdale Hospital training and training at the high rise building located at 21 Spinning Wheel in Hinsdale.
3. COVID 19 Report:

4. Emergency Medical Services Report:
 - On Tuesday evening, July 11th, eighteen (18) Firefighter EMT's and Paramedics participated in EMS continuing education.
5. Emergency Management Report:
 - A tornado warning was issued for Southwest DuPage County, which included Clarendon Hills on Wednesday, July 12th at 5:45 PM. The three (3) outdoor severe weather warning sirens in the village were activated by DuComm at that time. Additional Fire Department personnel staffed the station during this time. No tornado incidents or damage occurred in Clarendon Hills. Later DuPage County Emergency Management asked for any damage reports. I reported to them that there was no damage in Clarendon Hills.
