As your newly elected Village President, I look forward to serving the residents of the Village. My wife Beth and I raised our children here through Walker School, CHMS, and Hinsdale Central. This is a very special Village, and I am honored to be chosen to lead it as we enter our centennial year.

Building on the foundations left by the previous Village Board, I plan to continue the strong financial management, including going above and beyond our audit standards and continuing to maintain a AAA bond rating. This allows the Village to weather any economic storms without sacrificing our high standards for Village services. At the same time, I plan to keep the government lean and taxes as low as reasonably possible.

The community has a long history of professional management, a history I will continue. On that note, one of my first actions as Village President was to appoint longtime Assistant Village Manager Zach Creer to Village Manager. Zach brings to the Village a historical perspective and quality relationships with the existing community and staff. Zach has 14 years of experience in the field including working in Geneva, Rolling Meadows, La Grange, and Lake County. He has a master's degree in public administration with a specialization in urban management. It was not a decision I made lightly, and I relied heavily on the recommendations of outgoing Manager Barr, former President Austin, community members, and my own personal experience working as an executive in the private sector.

I want to thank Kevin Barr and the outgoing Village President, Trustees, and Clerk for their service to the Village. Kevin and the Board have guided the Village through some significant issues including the covid shutdowns, the new train station, and the creation of the downtown TIF. We can already see their many accomplishments starting to bloom downtown, and the quality of staff they leave behind.

One area I do believe the Village can continue to make strides in is increasing development and the health of our business community. My predecessors set the stage by creating the Downtown TIF and implementing public improvements under the Downtown Revitalization Project. But their work was not completed, and there are still several vacant/underdeveloped parcels within the downtown. Even though many vacancies have been filled, others have been created. I expect the Village to actively work with the Village's landlords, provide funding, and find the right businesses that can drive positive momentum into the downtown.

I am honored to have this opportunity to serve the residents of Clarendon Hills and am looking forward to all we can accomplish during the next four years.

BURLINGTON AVENUE – CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The 100-year-old water main and portions of the storm sewers along Burlington Avenue have been replaced. We truly appreciated all those who avoided the area during this very extensive project. At the time of this publication, we hope to have all the restoration of the parkways completed. Able-bodied residents are asked to assist in watering the sod if possible. The contractor will water three times per week until the grass is established. After it is established, residents are responsible for the watering.

Later this summer the next phase of pavement resurfacing of Burlington Avenue will take place. This project, once it starts will take about 4 weeks, weather permitting. Notice of the work start time will be posted on our website, within Public Works' weekly reports, and on the Village's Facebook page so residents will be aware of the paving project.

Your patience is highly appreciated as we improve this portion of our Village streets.

VEHICLE STICKERS DUE!

Residents are required to purchase a village sticker for each vehicle they will have housed in Clarendon Hills. The annual license period begins July 1st of each year and ends on June 30th of the next year. Stickers can be purchased online and in person at the Village Hall or Police Department.

New residents must obtain a Village Sticker within 30 days of moving to the Village.

Passenger Car \$40, Motorcycle \$30, and Seniors (62+) 50% off (1 per discounted rate per senior). An additional 50% late fee will be added to stickers purchased after July 31st.



Staff and the Village Board would like to thank resident Dan Cosgrove for his contribution to the Village's 100 year Anniversary.

In anticipation of our 100-year anniversary in 2024, we sought a logo to use for the celebration. Resident Dan Cosgrove of Cosgrove Design, stepped up, volunteered, and designed several choices for a group of local organizations to review. Several designs were reviewed, discussed, and we chose the current logo shown here. We felt the logo was a nod to the 1920s since we were established in 1924, yet it keeps the feel and the recognizable parts of the Village, without using

the daisy that is part of our current Village logo. The 100 year logo has been shared with local organizations for their use with events to be held during the 2024 year. You'll find this design on the Village sticker for the 2023-2024!

Animal Licenses (July 1st - June 30th yearly)

A \$15 annual pet license is required for anyone that owns a dog or cat that is more than 4 months old and resides within the Village. Pet Licenses can be purchased in person at the Village Hall or the Police Station. The application requires the name/ address of the owner or keeper; pet name, breed, sex or neutered, and color of each animal to be licensed. When completing an application for a dog and/or cat license, the application shall be accompanied by a veterinarian certificate showing that the animal has been given rabies inoculation shots. Every owner of a dog and/or cat shall firmly secure a current Village animal license tag to the licensed dog and/or cat using a collar.

Renew or correct your Drivers license/State ID (If driving test not required), get new license plate stickers and/or register to be an organ donor.
