**Recent Training, Meetings and Events**

- This month's Police Law online training pertains to new Illinois laws.

**Recent incidents:**

January 26, 10:44am, officers responded to the Jewel Foods for a violation of an order of protection complaint. Officers could not substantiate the claim. Advice given.

January 26, 2:52pm, officers spoke with a resident regarding a disturbing letter that was found in their mailbox. Officers gave advice.

January 26, 9:48pm, officers were notified by the suicide hotline that a subject in crisis was possibly in our town and was threatening suicide by train. Officer located the subject near our depot and had them transported for observation.

January 27, 12:43pm, officers responded to the 400 block of Colfax for a hit and run crash. The victim's vehicle was hit while parked on the street. Pending.

January 27, 10:21pm, officers responded to the 55<sup>th</sup> St. bridge over 83 for report of someone jumping off the bridge. Upon arrival, officers located an uncooperative, highly intoxicated subject, who was covered in mud. Apparently, the subject was walking home from a wedding after a fight with their spouse. They fell near the bridge, but not over it.

January 28, 5:46pm, officers assisted Westmont PD with a vehicle vs. pedestrian crash at Ogden and Oxford.

January 30, 7:43pm, officers were traveling in the 300 block of Harris when an SUV passed their squad at a high rate of speed. Shortly thereafter, the SUV left the roadway and crashed into a tree. While rendering aid to the driver, officers noted an indication of intoxication. After being treated at the hospital, the driver was taken into custody and charged with DUI.

January 30, 10:18pm, officers responded to an apartment on Concord for a domestic. It turned out to be a verbal argument. Officer gave advice.
