Dear Neighbors,

What a kickoff to our year of Centennial celebrations! At the Village Board Meeting on January 22nd, which is the same day the Village was incorporated in 1924, all attendees were treated to a great performance by the Clarendon Hills Middle School Jazz Band, led by Director Eric Morong. A proclamation was read, there was cake, and a preview of the Centennial Documentary which is expected later this year was shown. Thank you to the Centennial Committee and Village Staff for organizing this event and giving us a glimpse of Clarendon Hills through the years. The arrival of Spring signals a time for growth and opportunity. Before we know it, Summer will be here. The Village Board continues to be focused on downtown revitalization. In preparation for warmer weather at the January meeting, the Board approved a proposal with Gary R. Weber & Associates to create a site plan and conceptual drawing for outdoor dining. The current barriers were installed during the pandemic as a temporary measure. The goal is to have guidelines and create a more aesthetically pleasing environment that all who visit and dine in our downtown can enjoy. The Board has also tried to be responsive to the needs of the business community and those who visit downtown by changing the non-permit parking hours of the Metra parking lot from 3 pm to noon on weekdays. Parking wayfinding signage is also a focus for the Board.

As I mention the change in seasons and plan for our downtown, it is important we all embrace the rights of seasonal passage. Several Village Departments are entering a change in season. We are conducting a statewide search for a new Fire Chief. Chief Leahy is officially set to retire. In addition, several Department members are separated from the department. We wish them all well.

On February 20, 2024, Ed Leinweber was sworn in as the new Police Chief. Ed has been with the Village for 23 years and I'm confident he will continue the Department's tradition of excellence in our Police Department. We applaud and thank our outgoing Chief of Police Paul Dalen for his 30 years of service. He has dedicated his career to helping make Clarendon Hills a safer and better community. For that, and for everything Chief Dalen accomplished, we owe him a huge debt of thanks. Chief Dalen is well respected, and it is for that reason the Village Board plans to have him continue to serve the Village as Director of Public Safety. My hope is that his insight and wisdom can guide the Village's Public Safety Departments through this change of season.

Finally, we know Spring is also when many residents take on home improvement and yard projects. Thank you for taking pride in your properties and adding to the beautification of Clarendon Hills

Where do your property taxes go?

The Village of Clarendon Hills portion of your tax bill is about 12% of a property owner's real estate tax bill which funds the Village's core services. The Village continues to provide outstanding value for your tax dollars by keeping the streets and public areas neat and well maintained, providing police and fire protection, reliable water service and doing these as efficiently as possible. The remaining 88% of the taxes property owners pay, supports the various school districts, park district, forest preserve, library, DuPage County, and Downers Grove Township as stated on property tax bills.

Property Taxation - Tax Levy

The property taxes you will be paying in 2024 are for what is called the "2023 Tax Levy Year".

Tax Rate

The tax rate is derived from dividing the tax levy by the assessed value and multiplying that number by 100. It is the common factor used to determine the tax contribution of a property. Given the estimated assessed value and the recommended tax levy, the Village's 2023 tax levy rate (exclusive of the Library) is estimated to be 0.7001, an increase of 0.0035 from the prior year rate of .06966.

The estimated increase in the Village's 2023 equalized assessed valuation (EAV) would be the tenth increase since the 2014 levy as the overall. The following is a ten-year history of the Village's tax rates and assessed valuations.

Based on an average home value of \$800,000 in Clarendon Hills, taxes paid to the Village in 2024 would be \$1,824.93 This estimate assumes a residential exemption of \$6,000.

Garbage Cans

Garbage cans should be placed at the end of your driveway and not on the street which includes the concrete ribbons. This keeps our narrow streets as wide as possible for cars to safely go around garbage trucks and other vehicles. It also makes it easier and safer for our crews to clear the streets in case of a snow event. In addition, cans should be brought up from the curb the day of collection.
