Because our Village is downtown centric, with any resident within a mile from the downtown, people walk to our restaurants and shops, while kids ride their bikes to hang out with their friends. I ask that when you drive through our Village during these lovely months of the year that you pay extra attention to the pedestrians around you. We also ask that our residents use crosswalks and sidewalks when walking through town, and that parents advise their kids that they need to walk their bikes, not ride them in the downtown, per Village ordinance.

While the halfway mark of 2024 is quickly approaching it has been a busy and successful year on many levels, particularly on the economic development front. Despite reports and concerns that inflation is still present and decreasing more slowly than hoped, our community's economic development prospects continue to look bright. There is excitement about a new TIF District (Tax Increment Financing) in the southern part of the Village around the 55th Street Corridor. There is opportunity for residential and business development and infrastructure improvements. The downtown TIF is getting a much-needed boost with a new residential and commercial project. These projects all take time, compromise and extensive planning.

As we enter our centennial summer, we do so knowing that by working together we can advance opportunities for development and redevelopment. We also will mark business, civic, and personal milestones; welcome new merchants who want to call Clarendon Hills home; and gather for public celebrations. This is achieved by following the guiding priorities set by our Village

Board, which are good governance, economic opportunity, environmental stewardship, excellent Village services, and quality of life. Have a safe Summer!

Economic Development

In economic development news, Little Creperie is due to relocate across the street to 95 Park Avenue with support from the Village in the form of Tax Increment Financing (TIF) funds. Work is underway at the new 95 Park Avenue location with a late Spring date expected for a grand opening. An expanded food and drink menu and outdoor dining will be some significant changes to Little Creperie.

Sparrow Coffee is planning on remodeling the entire building at 100 Park Avenue with TIF funding support from the Village. Initially, the Village was interested in filling the vacant Starbucks space. However, to realize their vision, Sparrow requested that the Village

relocate the other two existing businesses within the 100 Park Avenue building. Both businesses (State Farm Insurance and Little Creperie) have or are moving elsewhere within the Village of Clarendon Hills with TIF assistance. A key component of the Village's economic development strategy is to retain existing businesses while also attracting new businesses to the Village.

The former Quinn's Coffee building at 2 S. Prospect Avenue has been leased to a local Interior Design Company, Amy Scott Interior Design. This building had been vacant for over seven years and the Village is excited to see a new and local business operate from this location. Some decorative interior improve-

ments are planned, and the new business has recently opened its doors as "Curated by Amy Scott".

The Village has received significant interest in redeveloping the former Tracy's Tavern site on 55th Street. It is likely the developer will request a planned unit development (PUD) type development, because it has a proposed mix of uses including a residential buffer and a service and food related use.

The second phase of Mycroft Row is under construction on Burlington Avenue and is scheduled to be completed in 2025. This building will mirror phase I of the development and have residential units in the back and


commercial units up front by Burlington Ave.

The Village of Clarendon Hills 2024 Water Quality Report has been published. Watering Restrictions

Water Restrictions are enforced from May 15th - September 15th. Residents south of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on odd numbered day (1st, 3rd, 5th, etc.) Residents north of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on even numbered days (2nd, 4th, 6th, etc.)

NO WATERING IS ALLOWED BETWEEN 10 AM AND 4 PM.

Please note that watering restrictions apply to lawns, trees, shrubs and gardens only.

Permits for watering newly installed lawns and landscaping are available at the Village Hall.
