Recent Training, Meetings and Events:

- Recruit Espinosa was sworn in with the department as our newest police officer on 5/1/2024.
- Several officers attended an eight-hour in-house rifle training class.
- Sgt Finrock conducted safety training with Prospect School.
- Det Michalek responded to assist a neighboring jurisdiction with the CHPD drone for a missing person.
- Sgt Porter attended a NEMRT class on police supervisor liability.
- Sgt Finrock and I attended a DU-COMM steering committee meeting and the annual MERIT review meeting.

Recent incidents:

April 26, 9:19am, officers met with a resident on the 5700 block of Holmes Ave regarding several complaints of someone stealing their delivered newspapers. Investigation revealed the papers were not stolen and in fact never delivered due to the paid subscription having ended.

April 26, 11:00pm, officers responded to the area of 55th St and the ramp from s/b Rte 83 for a well-being check. Upon arrival, officers met with a couple having a domestic issue. Officers calmed down the situation and the parties agreed to separate. Domestic resources info and advice were provided.

April 27, 3:01pm, officers responded to a business on Ogden Ave for a trespassing complaint. A former employee had shown up at the business and was asked by the management to leave. Officers were familiar with the subject from previous contacts and placed them into custody on unrelated charges. The subject was subsequently transported to the DuPage County jail.

April 29, 3:26pm, officers met with a resident at the station regarding his vehicle being taken without permission. The vehicle was parked and left unattended by the owner unlocked with the keys in the ignition and running while they briefly went back to their residence. Upon returning, the vehicle was gone. The vehicle was located shortly thereafter abandoned on 56th near Holmes Ave. Investigation pending.

April 30, 10:29am, a resident reported she dropped her purse while boarding a Metra commuter train. Officers searched the area with negative results and provided advice on identity theft. Further investigation revealed the purse was picked up by a good Samaritan and later returned to the resident.

May 1, 10:56am, officers met with a resident at the station who reported being contacted numerous times by a subject who has been advised to cease contact. Officers assisted the resident and provided advice on an order of protection.

May 2, 9:16am, while conducting traffic enforcement on the one hundred block of Chicago Ave, officers observed a vehicle traveling w/b at a speed higher than the posted speed limit. Upon speaking with the driver, officers learned the driver also had a suspended license. The driver was cited for speeding and driving while license was suspended and then released.
