

2024 Road Program

The Village maintains about 26 Miles of road within the Village. The annual road program resurfaces worn pavement and replaces damaged or defective curbs within the Village boundaries each year. The 2024 Road Program will include the following locations.

- Holmes Avenue from 55th Street to 58th Street
- 58th Street from Holmes Avenue to Route 83
- 56th Street from Barclay Court to Holmes Avenue
- Village Hall parking lot
- McIntosh Alley
- Various Municipal driveways and parking areas
- Pedestrian Safety Improvements in the Downtown business District

These projects are expected to start mid July and be finished by October 31st of this year. The Pedestrian Safety Improvements in the Downtown Business District will occur in last August after the Dancin' in the Street Concert Series ends.

No More Vehicle Stickers

The Village Board voted to eliminate the required vehicle sticker. So if you have the Centennial sticker on your car, you are welcome to keep it there in celebration.

Animal Licenses (July 1st - June 30th yearly)

A \$15 annual pet license is required for anyone that owns a dog or cat that is more than 4 months old and resides within the Village. Pet Licenses can be purchased in person at the Village Hall or the Police Station. The application requires the name/address of the owner or keeper; pet name, breed, sex or neutered, and color of each animal to be licensed. When completing an application for a dog and/or cat license, the application shall be accompanied by a veterinarian certificate showing that the animal has been given rabies inoculation shots. Every owner of a dog and/or cat shall firmly secure a current Village animal license tag to the licensed dog and/or cat using a collar.

Secretary of State Mobile Unit

Clarendon Hills Bank is once again hosting the Secretary of State Mobile Unit on Monday, July 22nd from 10 AM to 2 PM at the Village Hall Board Room. **NEW THIS YEAR** is that **Appointments are REQUIRED for this event.** Call Clarendon Hills Bank at 630-321-2192 to register. Walk ins will **not** be accepted.

Renew or correct your Driver's license/State ID (If driving test is not required), get new license plate stickers and/or register to be an organ donor.

yourself, family members, your home, pets and even vehicles that will automatically display on the 9-1-1 call taker's screen when you make an emergency call.
