Dear Neighbors,

I hope all of you enjoyed a restful and fun-filled summer. I am pleased to provide you with Village updates.

Budget - We take pride in maintaining high-quality services for our community and sound financial planning which keeps the Village well positioned financially with healthy reserves. In 2025, staff anticipates taking the full amount allowed under the tax cap legislation. This amount is 3.4%, well below last year's amount of 5%. The budget as presented, only plans for the growth allowed as a measure of CPI, and not taking into account any of the "new-growth" that we know is occurring in the Village. The net effect on average for existing residents and businesses is that property taxes will be increased by less than they might otherwise be.

2024 Road Program - We resurfaced Holmes Ave from 58th to 55th Street, 56th St. from Barclay Ct. to Forest Hills Dr., and 58th St. from Holmes Ave. to the East End Road. There was additional work completed in the downtown and to various driveways, alleys, and parking lots. The 2024 Road Program was funded by Rebuild Illinois Bond Funds, Motor Fuel Tax Funds, Local Funds, and DCEO Grants from legislators.

Development - The Village Board met recently to discuss economic development strategic planning. The Board is committed to smart growth and development. Particularly with regard to the proposed 55th Street Tax Increment Finance District (TIF). The Downtown TIF District has seen a 50% increase in Equalized Assessed Value (EAV) and has allowed the Village to assist many businesses while improving the community. The Village hopes to work with fellow taxing bodies especially the school districts to ensure all stakeholders benefit.

Pedestrian Safety/E Bikes – The Police Department is taking proactive steps to work with the schools on an E bike education campaign. Signs have been installed in the downtown area and the Village Board will be updating the ordinance to enforce the rules of the road through the adjudication process.

Events - The Holiday Walk kicks off at Village Hall at 6 pm on December 6th with the lighting of the trees. I hope you'll join us for this family-friendly event. It is one of my favorite events each year and gives us all a chance to celebrate the holidays with our friends and neighbors.

Finally, I've heard nothing but rave reviews about the Centennial Concert and Drone Show held in September at Prospect Park! It's estimated that at least 1500 people attended. Thank you to our Centennial Steering Committee. Also, a big thank you to our police, fire, and public works departments who took time from their personal lives on a Sunday to run operations, and Village Hall Staff for creating signage, fielding residents' questions, and handing out wristbands. The Park District were very gracious hosts along with the Hinsdale Golf Club who allowed the Village to launch the Drone Show from their property. Chamber Director Shannon McDonald was also a huge help behind the scenes. AVM Johnson who worked tirelessly over the last few months on every detail, reported a *Sister Hazel* band member exclaimed: "so happy to be in this beautiful community, with beautiful friends on this beautiful evening..." I agree and that's why we live here.

All bagged yard waste (leaves, mixed grass leaves, fall clean up, etc.) shall be picked up. Yard waste pickup ends with December 4th and 5th pickup.

Winter Snow Reminders

Residents are required to park off the Village streets if the weather predicts 2 or more inches of snowfall. This is to allow for proper snow removal. *(It's recommended snow be removed from the top of your vehicle prior to driving!)*

No person shall dump snow onto any public road, public sidewalk or fire hydrant.

Garbage cans should be placed at the end of your driveway and not on the street which includes the concrete ribbons. This makes it easier and safer for our crews to clear the streets of snow and allows cars to go around garbage trucks picking up cans.
