Subject: Weekly Report

- 1. Police Messaging:** We are planning on ramping up communications on public information about keeping car doors locked and not leaving car keys stored in vehicles. You should be seeing an uptick in communications next week. This continues to be a problem in town and surrounding areas. At the Village Board meeting we got the recommendation to better utilize the messaging capabilities of our website, it is staff's opinion that we currently have better techniques through constant contact email list and Facebook given the limited number of people signed up for the website notification service (less than 20 residents). However, we will continue to monitor the service and explore ways to utilize it in the future.
- 2. Budget Preparation:** Finance Director Maureen Potempa, Zach Creer and I met to discuss capital project budgeting this week. Maureen also previewed revised budget forms for staff which are designed to provide more information in an easier to read format for staff, board members and the public. I am pleased with the work Maureen is doing and anticipate a better review process as a result. We will be discussing budget scheduling further with the Board at an upcoming meeting.
- 3. Car Show Confirmed:** We have confirmed that the Ferrari Club of America will be hosting a car show on Saturday June 24th. We are reserving the downtown parking spaces on the west side of Prospect Avenue that morning. They expect to have as many as 20 cars there starting at about 8 a.m. Hope you can come by, see the cars, and cater our downtown businesses.
- 4. Daisy Days and Daisy Dash Coming Soon:** Daisy Days (June 16th and June 17th) and Daisy Dash (June 18th) are next weekend. Daisy Days looks to have another great lineup. Subject: Department Report

1. The 2017 Road Improvement program is progressing nicely. Concrete work for the first side of all streets has been completed. Flowable fill has been placed and the new shoulders are being backfilled. Temporary gravel is being placed for residents with asphalt drive aprons to enable them to resume using their driveways. Concrete drive aprons will be ready for use by the end of today. Next week, the asphalt aprons will be installed and prep work will begin for the flip to the opposite side of the street which is scheduled to begin on June 19th.
2. The roof repair and re-shingling portion of the Village hall work has been completed. The existing weathervane is on its way to the cupola manufacturer for inclusion into the replacement structure. As of this writing, the replacement is due to arrive in eight weeks.
3. Daisy Days preparation is in full-force. The electrical panel is being overhauled and the new barricades are being readied for deployment. We will begin pre-staging these and other items Thursday. Elgin will sweep the curbs and gutters starting at 6 a.m. on Friday. The daisies on the pavement along the 5K course will also be repainted next week.
4. Graffiti on the west side of the Route 83 sound wall has been covered.
5. We will be watering flowers in the downtown both days this weekend because of the extremely hot and dry weather. We continue to work to make sure our downtown looks great this summer for all of the upcoming events.

1. Fire Prevention Bureau Activity during the past week.
 - Three (3) Fire Prevention/Life Safety Inspections were conducted.
 - Two (2) alarm system inspections were conducted.
2. Training Report:
 - Wednesday evening, twenty eight (28) firefighters attended weekly training. Water supply relay training was conducted.
 - Friday morning, Deputy Chief Krupp and Captain Rediehs participated in some live fire training and investigator training at a house to be demolished in Westmont.
3. Emergency Medical Services Report:
 - No report.
4. Clarendon Hills/Hinsdale FD sharing of services report:
 - No report.
5. Emergency Management Report:
 - No report this week.
6. DuComm Report:
 - On Wednesday morning I attended the DuComm Support Services Committee meeting. At this meeting normal business was conducted along with detailed explanations of the new CAD system and some 9-1-1 problems in the county.
7. The new Heavy Duty Rescue Squad 86 is in its 10th week of construction and is progressing rapidly. Deputy Chief Krupp, Lieutenant Godek, Engineer Laffey and I traveled to Pierce in Wisconsin on Monday June 5th for a mid construction inspection. At this inspection we clarified many items and made minor changes and inspected the vehicle in detail. One (1) more and hopefully change order was made during this inspection. A change was made in how the Hydraulic Rescue Equipment will be stored and secured in the vehicle. Pierce representatives have informed us that they are targeting a completion date for this vehicle sometime during the week of June 19th. Some time soon after they we will again travel to Pierce to conduct the final inspection. After the inspection the vehicle will remain at Pierce for about another week to correct expected items on our punch list. After that the vehicle will be delivered to the Pierce Dealer in Aurora for final cleanup and correction of any other defects. We are anticipating on accepting the vehicle at the dealer in Aurora during the 2nd week in July. Every week Pierce takes photos of the

vehicle in production and sends them to customers. Attached are the week 9 photos that were taken on June 2, 2017. I should receive week 9 photos later today or tomorrow.

8. On Saturday afternoon, Deputy Chief Krupp and I will be attending the fire academy graduation for recruit firefighters Alex Dorow, Scott Larem and Austin Schlicher at the Western Springs Fire Department. Recruit firefighters from Clarendon Hills, LaGrange Park and Western Springs were in this academy.
9. On Thursday, on duty firefighters provided a fire truck ride to school for three (3) children and one (1) adult. This prize was purchased at a school PTO silent auction.
