Subject: Weekly Report

- 1. Chamber Meeting:** The Chamber of Commerce met in the Village Hall on Wednesday morning. This time a combination of several inches of rain, melting and melted snow and still frozen ground led to localized flooding on Tuesday. Our Public Works crews were on top of the event and did their best to keep our systems clear and working. We will review the results and include them in our already authorized engineering study.
- 3. Daily Scoop Opening:** On a much lighter note, and a good sign for improved weather coming, the Daily Scoop opened this Thursday for the season. Limited hours (Thursday-Sunday) are expected for a few weeks. A reminder to all of us to cater to and enjoy local businesses.

1. At the SSA #31 Public Hearing on Tuesday night I mistakenly stated that the water mains on "Arthur and Woodstock" would be replaced. The correct streets are "Arthur and Tuttle". I apologize for the confusion I have caused due to my misstatement. We are preparing a letter to send to the residents who attended the meeting to provide clarification.
2. We were in full flood control mode on Tuesday. Our rain gauge totaled 2.25" of rain from 11:00 on Monday morning through 8:00 Tuesday morning. Though the ground was still frozen and the runoff included the melt-off of 15" of snow, our system contained the stormwater with a few exceptions. The most notable was curb land flooding in the 400 block of Park Avenue. We generally do not see flooding on Park until the adjacent Park Avenue Basin and the McDaniels Court basins are overtopped. In Tuesday's case, Blue Lake was still iced over, so 100% of the runoff from the tributary area north and west of it ran directly under the BNSF tracks without mixing and slowly raising the level in the lake as it would do normally. This circumstance will be added to the analysis being performed by CBBEL. There may be a way to divert future occurrences of this phenomenon through the addition of a weir gate or valve that could be operated automatically and monitored remotely, not dissimilar to the SCADA system through which we manage our drinking water system.
3. We salted the platforms early Wednesday morning and have kept the 3-ton trucks loaded in case the forecast were to be too optimistic. Fortunately, in this case it, was accurate and we did not deploy any assets yesterday or this morning. Consequently, we are spending today unloading the trucks putting them through a desalinization process (washing them).
4. One round of pothole patching was performed yesterday.

Significant traffic and criminal activity during the period February 16th through February 22nd, 2018.

February 16, 8:05am, officers responded to Jewel for a subject passed out in a vehicle. While speaking with the Berwyn resident, officers discovered his driver's license was suspended. The subject was placed into custody and his vehicle was administratively towed. During the arrest process, officers discovered a controlled substance in the subject's vehicle. The subject was charged with driving on a suspended driver's license, no insurance and possession of a controlled substance. He was transported to DuPage County Jail.

February 16, 7:44pm, officers responded to the 10blk of Mohawk for the identity theft complaint. The victim advised that his debit card was used by an unknown subject to withdrawal money from his bank account. Pending

February 16, 1:35pm, officers responded to the station for a fraud report. The victim advised officers that she was using her computer and it "crashed". A short time later, a message and phone number appeared on the screen advising the victim to call "tech

Parents,


For the past several weeks, officers from the Clarendon Hills Police Department have been working with CHMS and Prospect School officials to address traffic safety issues during afternoon student pick-up. The main traffic safety issue concerns the parents who stop or stand in the travel lanes and marked medians on Chicago Ave while waiting to enter the school parking lots during pick-up. This causes traffic to backup and forces non-school related traffic to weave in and out of the stopped cars. This is especially dangerous when parents allow their children to walk onto Chicago Ave and get into the car rather than pick the child up at the proper staging area. Chicago Ave is clearly marked as a no parking zone. As such, parents will no longer be able to stop, stand or park on Chicago Ave unless they are in the marked left turn lane. If a parent does not have room to pull into either driveway, then I suggest the parent go around the block or locate a legal parking space to wait. Parents may use Oxford Ave between Norfolk and Chicago as a pick-up/drop off area. Moving forward, the Clarendon Hills Police Department will be enforcing the no parking zone on Chicago Ave. Attached, you will find maps that show the no parking zones and alternate pick-up area. 



NO parking/standing on Chicago Ave

Subject: Weekly Department Report 2018-07

1. Fire Prevention Bureau Activity during the past week.
 - Lt. Dave Godek is working with Dan Ungerleider on reviewing the new/proposed IRC Codes that are being looked for adoption in a few months.
 - Lt. Godek is working with a church and also a townhouse on the replacement of their old fire alarm systems that are failing.
 - Several fire alarm issues in various buildings were corrected.
2. Training Report:
 - Wednesday evening, twenty two (22) Firefighters attended fire suppression training. Topics included equipment orientation, review of recent fire incident and response procedures.
3. Emergency Medical Services Report:
 - On Tuesday, all village owned AED's from all department buildings, squad cars, public works truck and fire apparatus along with several privately owned AED's were brought to the fire station for their annual maintenance checks and certification performed by a 3rd party vendor. Also the two (2) fire department cardiac monitors/defibrillators were serviced and re-certified for another year.
4. Clarendon Hills/Hinsdale FD sharing of services report:
 - No report.
5. Emergency Management Report:
 - No report.
6. Du-Comm Report:
 - No report.
7. On Tuesday, Finance Director Potempa and I met with a representative from Andres Medical Billing to coordinate the final details and procedures for the switch of ambulance billing services to Andres on March 1st.

8. Engine 86, a 2002 Pierce pumper has been taken out of service due to a power steering gear box failure. The two (2) power steering gear boxes have been ordered and will be replaced by Wirs Industries in McHenry during the 1st week of March. The cost estimate for these repairs is approximately \$12,000 to \$15,000. Ladder 86 and Engine 86 are both about 16 years old and are requiring more frequent maintenance and repairs due to their age. Both are scheduled for replacement in the year 2022.

9. Incidents of Interest:

- Monday, February 19th at 7:50 PM. Ladder 86, Hinsdale Engine 84, Engine 86, Squad 86, Medic 86 and Chief 86 were dispatched for a structure fire in the area of 56th Place and Holmes Ave. Upon arrival firefighters found the rear portion of a 2 flat fully involved in fire. We also notified the Tri State Fire Protection District upon arrival that this 2 flat located at 16W611 56th Place is not in the village and is in their jurisdiction. Clarendon Hills and Hinsdale Firefighters extinguished most of the fire on the rear porch, attic and 1st floor of the structure before the arrival of Tri State. After the fire was extinguished, the structure and investigation was turned over to Tri State.
- Tuesday, February 20th at 6:18 PM. Ladder 86 and Medic 86 responded to 434 McDaniels circle for a person trapped in a stuck elevator. The elevator was manually lowered to the ground and the person was safely removed from the elevator.
- Wednesday, February 21st at 7:04 PM. Clarendon Hills Medic 86, Squad 86 and Hinsdale Engine 84 were dispatched for an accident with injuries on 55th St. at Western Ave. Hinsdale Medic 84 was also called to the scene for a 2nd injured patient. Two patients transported to local hospitals in M84 and M86.

10. Mutual Aid Calls:

- Sunday, February 18th at 10:31 AM. Engine 86 responded for a change of quarters request for the Pleasantview Fire Protection District at their station #2 located at 7675 Wolf Rd. in Burr Ridge.

11. Fire/Rescue/EMS calls:

- The Hinsdale Fire Department responded Automatic Aid to Clarendon Hills three (3) times.
- The Clarendon Hills Fire Department responded Automatic Aid to Hinsdale two (2) times.
- During the past week, the fire department responded to twenty two (22) emergency calls.
