1. The Park Avenue tank re-coating project is underway. The monopole has been removed from the top and various welding repairs are underway. Interior repairs are also being made. Repairs will continue into next week when pressure washing should get underway in earnest.
2. The pre-construction meeting for the 2018 Road Improvement program was held on Wednesday. A tentative start date of May 29th has been set. As soon as a full schedule is generated, it will be provided to all stakeholders.
3. It has been a busy week of landscaping, planting, and clean-up throughout all planting beds in town. A few small areas remain for next week.
4. A significant main break occurred at 10 pm on Wednesday night at Western and Coventry. Dave Pendill, Joe Ferrel, Joe Coons, Collin Ferrel and Mike Bueser all came in and worked until 2 am Thursday morning to repair the break. The excavation must settle for a few weeks before we put a temporary asphalt patch over it. The permanent patch will be completed in the fall.

1. **ZBA/PC - Zoning Ordinance Modernization Project.** Last night the ZBA/PC continued their workshop discussion review the draft zoning ordinance. During this workshop we reviewed revised regulations regarding the Downtown Design Review Overlay District and a consolidated listing of permitted and conditional uses by District. Their next meeting will be a special meeting on Wednesday, June 6, 2018 at 7:00 pm. 2. **ZBA/PC - Case Z489/Special Use at 144 Burlington Avenue.** Last night the ZBA/PC conducted a public hearing for a special use request for private automobile storage and office space at 144 Burlington Avenue, fka Clarendon Hills Auto Repair. Upon completion of the hearing, the ZBA/PC passed a motion to recommend approval of the requested special use. Their recommendation will be forwarded to the Village Board for consideration at the June 4th Village Board meeting. 3. **Richmond Education Gardens & Apiary.** Public Works continued to grade the property in preparation for installation of the project cistern and underground drainage system. Tomorrow the Clarendon Hills Park Foundation will be hosting a "Bees on Parade" Bee Reveal Party at noon at the Clarendon Hills Park District Community Center. During the Party guests will have a chance to view and vote for their favorite painted bee sculpture. Next week the Park Foundation will place each of the 14 painted bees throughout the Village for all to see.
4. **Permits.** So far in May, the Village has issued twenty four (24) permits, including one (1) new home, having a reported combined construction value of \$795,000.

1. Fire Prevention Bureau Activity during the past week.
 - Ten (10) Fire/Life Safety Inspections were conducted during the past week.
 - Lt. Godek has been working with representatives of Park Ave. Station on the repairs needed for their underground fire suppression sprinkler system water main to the building at 446 McDaniels.
2. Training Report:
 - Wednesday evening, twenty two (22) firefighters participated in a joint training drill with Hinsdale firefighters. This was a pumping and master stream drill located near the Clarendon Hills pool.
3. Emergency Medical Services Report:
 - On Friday, Lt. Godek and I will be attending the annual Loyola Awards Ceremony that will be held in Oak Brook Terrace.
4. Clarendon Hills/Hinsdale FD sharing of services report:
 - No report.
5. Emergency Management Report:
 - No report.
6. Du-Comm Report:
 - On Thursday morning, May 17th I attended the Du-Comm Fire Operations Sub Committee meeting in Carol Stream. At this meeting we reviewed the operation of three (3) Box Alarm fires during the last month. We also discussed the Standardization Committee report dealing with the dispatching of emergency incidents quicker. Several suggestions were discussed. To start dispatchers will undergo training to obtain 9-1-1 information quicker to shorten these dispatch times. Also discussed was the use of Mobile Data Computers (MDC) by all agencies. I proposed that Du-Comm change its policy from recommended to mandatory regarding the use of the MDC's for all vehicle call status changes instead of voice transmissions on the radio. This proposal will leave the radio channel more available for emergency communications while also taking some of the load off of the dispatcher to manually enter these status changes. After much discussion the committee voted to recommend this proposal. Du-Comm staff will make changes to the Du-Comm written directive making the use of the MDC's mandatory and will present this to the Chiefs Committee in June for possible approval.

7. On Thursday, Lt. Godek and I met on site with representatives of the Village Hinsdale, Lions Pool and the Lions Club regarding roadwork on Hinsdale Ave. near Stough and Jackson St. in Hinsdale that will close the east entrance to the Lions Pool parking lot. The east entrance will be closed on or about May 31st and reopened on July 2nd. During this 33 day closure the Emergency Fire Lane gate at the pool will be locked in the open position so that Lions parking lot commuters can get into and out of the parking lot via Byrd Ct.
8. Incidents of Interest:
 - Friday, May 11th at 4:13 PM. The fire department along with Hinsdale Engine 85 responded to a fire alarm at the high-rise at 434 McDaniels Circle. Upon arrival firefighters found an underground watermain that connects 434 and 446 McDaniels had ruptured. Repairs to this watermain are currently in process.
 - Saturday, May 12th at 4:43 PM. Medic 86 and Squad 86 responded to a vehicle accident with injuries on Prospect Ave. just south of the BNSF crossing. One (1) injured patient transported to a local hospital.
 - Wednesday, May 16th at 1:43 PM. Ladder 86, Engine 86, Squad 86, Medic 86, Chief 86 and Hinsdale Engine 85 responded to a kitchen fire at 255 Ann St. Upon arrival firefighters found an oven on fire with flames also on the walls on cabinets. Fire extinguished quickly. Damage is estimated at \$15,000.
9. Mutual Aid Calls:
 - Hinsdale Medic 84 responded to one (1) EMS call in Clarendon Hills
10. Fire/Rescue/EMS calls:
 - The Hinsdale Fire Department responded Automatic Aid to Clarendon Hills four (4) times.
 - The Clarendon Hills Fire Department responded Automatic Aid to Hinsdale four (4) times.
 - During the past week, the fire department responded to twenty three (23) emergency calls.
