Message from the President

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

As I write this letter, we have just finished a very hot but successful Daisy Days and Daisy Dash. My congratulations to all participants and class winners of the hottest Dash I can remember. Many thanks to all the volunteers who have been planning for months and taken time from family and work to contribute to two of our town's signature events.

I am excited to announce the Village has received nearly \$3 million in grants to make improvements to our Downtown! There is a lot of planning that needs to take place. The work is expected to take place in 2019-2020. We applied for the grant to improve the design and condition of our streets, commuter drop off area and bicycle shelters which are very old and can be made safer and more inviting. With a new bike shelter coming it is my hope, as a bicyclist that, more people will bike to town to catch the train, visit our merchants, restaurants and of course enjoy a scoop of ice cream. Other intersections in town will receive updated designs to improve automotive and pedestrian traffic flow. More information will be available on the Village's website as we get closer to construction so be sure to check it out.


We have all watched the development of the 88 Park Avenue and 229 Park Avenue buildings. We admire how they have added to the look and feel of the Village as they near completion. What you may not have noticed is that we have required the developers to improve Village right of ways as part of their construction. The Park-Prospect intersection is narrower and the distance pedestrians have to cross is shorter which has improved the safety and flow of traffic due to 88 Park's construction. Meanwhile 229 Park Avenue's developer replaced the entire alley directly east of its project.

We have other great financial news to share regarding the three major capital projects in town. The Park Avenue water tower recoating, the Water Main Replacement Program and the 2018 Road Improvement Program, all came in hundreds of thousands of dollars under budget. The Road Improvement Program's construction is underway while the Water Main Replacement Program is finished and the Water tower recoating has been completed. If you have not seen the resurfaced tower, be sure to look at it next time you drive by, it looks great. The Water tower is located on the corner of Richmond and Park Avenue, next to the sledding hill.

I am also happy to announce Standard & Poor's recently reaffirmed our *AAA/stable* bond rating. The "AAA" rating is the highest rating available. It saves the Village thousands of dollars when issuing bonds. The "stable" means Standard & Poor's has no reasons to believe it will be changing any time soon and neither do I.





Parking on Grass

Residents should be aware that parking on the grass along the streets in Clarendon Hills is not allowed. Drivers causing damage to the grass may be held liable for the costs of repairs. Residents are responsible for informing their guests and contractors that they must park on the street, not off the street onto grass.

The new street ribbons (flat concrete curbs) are part of the street. They can be driven on and parked on. They add in extending the life of the asphalt portion of the streets.

Due to our already narrow streets, garbage cans should be placed at the end of your driveway, not on the street (ribbons).

Got Your Vehicle Stickers?

Vehicles: Residents are required to purchase a village sticker for each vehicle they will have housed in Clarendon Hills. The 2018-19 annual license period began July 1st. Stickers have been available for purchase since May 1st. If you haven't purchased yours yet and would like to avoid a ticket on top of the 50% late fee please stop in to the Village Hall or Police Station to buy your vehicle stickers as soon as possible.

New residents must obtain a Village Sticker within 30 days of moving to the Village. Passenger Car \$40, Motorcycle \$30, and Seniors (62+) 50% off. **An additional 50% late fee is added to stickers purchased after July 1st.**
