Subject: Weekly Report

1. **Chestnut Alley** – Planning continues for this project. Trustees Freve and Knoll spent some time with us on Monday to discuss the status of the project. As a follow-up, staff is meeting next week with DuPage County officials to discuss the bio swale portion of the project and if we can adjust the grant requirements. We will review this with the Public Services Committee in the next couple of weeks.
2. **2019 Road Program Review Issues** – We continue to have discussions with many residents regarding potential petitions to stop the road program. We have received several letters from residents stating that they are rescinding their signature on a petition. Review has continued regarding the possibility of widening Prospect, Walker or both. We will have more to report on Monday night. Attached is traffic data that was gathered for each street over a week period in February and March of this year. The most relevant point for our discussion is that Prospect has significantly higher traffic flow than Walker (about 4,600/day vs. 1,600/day (note that the data shown is “one-way”, thus these numbers are assumed to be double of what is shown). We will also discuss the details of these reports more thoroughly on Monday night.
3. **Land Use Committee Meeting** – I attended this meeting on Monday afternoon. The Committee completed a detailed review of the proposed comprehensive amendment to the Zoning Code. Several changes were suggested as a part of this review. This will go back to the Zoning Board for a public hearing and then back to the full Village Board for discussion and adoption. Thanks to Chairman Jordan and Trustees Freve and Knoll for spending the time on this review.

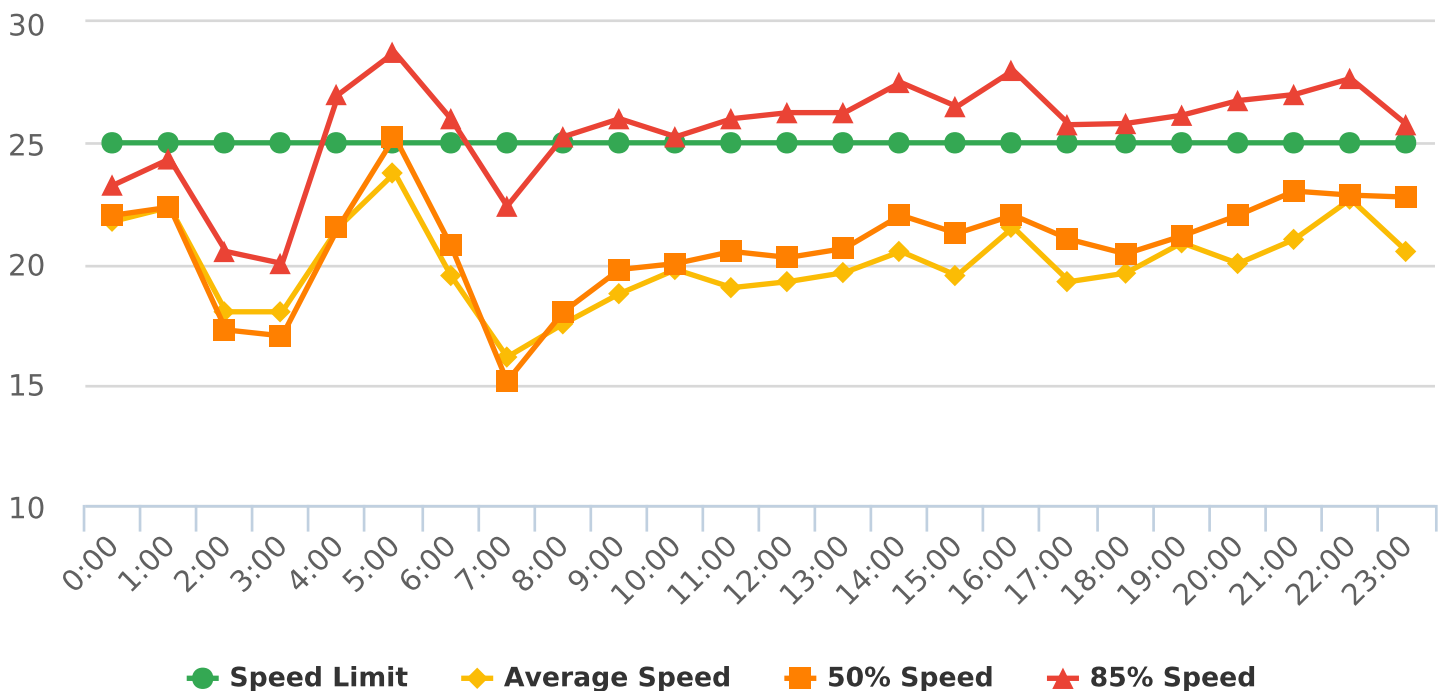

1. Our Water Operator attended a risk management consortium meeting that focused on public works departments. Some of the key topics they covered were safety related grants, training programs, accident investigation and chemical safety.
2. The water main project continued this week with completion of water main on Prospect. All water main is now installed and portions are being pressure tested and then will be chlorinated, water samples taken and tested and then placed into service. Next week crews will begin installing new water services to serve each home.
3. Crews conducted 30 parkway inspections, ground two tree stumps and restored the area with dirt and seed, cleaned up the area around Blue Lake trimming trees and placing fresh rock, continued to prep pavement edges for dirt and seed following the winter and installed several replacement signs throughout the village.
4. With our Resident Engineer and Foreman, I walked Prospect, Harris and Walker to review pavement widths and ditch conditions and tree locations to determine how they would be impacted should we receive direction to widen the pavement sections by one foot for each travel lane. From a constructability perspective this can be accomplished, however it will increase the amount of ditches that would have to be filled in with pipe and stormwater inlets as the edge of the concrete ribbons would narrow the ditch area and create steeper side slopes. The steeper side slopes are harder to maintain and could possibly create an unacceptable drop off.
5. I attended a DuPage Mayors and Managers Transportation Committee where we reviewed regionally beneficial projects and recommended three projects for regional funding through the Surface Transportation Program (STP) Shared Fund. The projects include the I-390 Extension, removing the last two-lane section of North Aurora Road between Naperville and Aurora under the railroad tracks and widening a portion of Route 53 south of Butterfield Road.
6. I attended a pollution presentation training session conducted by DuPage County's Stormwater Division. Its focus was on various municipal programs that can be implemented to improve the water quality in streams and lakes in DuPage County.
7. Assistance was provided during a meeting for the Downtown Revitalization program as budget plans were finalized for the new train station, landscaping and streetscape improvements north and south of the tracks.

1. Fire Prevention Bureau Activity during the past week.
 - Seven (7) Fire Prevention Life Safety Inspections were completed.
2. Training Report:

3. Emergency Medical Services Report:
 - Wednesday evening, twenty five (25) Firefighter Paramedics and EMT-B's attended monthly continuing education (CE) provided by a Loyola EMS Instructor. This month the CE was on Special Needs patients and how to handle them carefully.
4. Clarendon Hills/Hinsdale FD sharing of services report:
 - No report.
5. Emergency Management Report:

6. Du-Comm Report:
 - On Tuesday afternoon, Chief Dalen and I attended the Du-Comm Chiefs meeting. At this meeting the 3rd touch radio re-programming for all police departments radios were discussed, also all TC's have received 8 hours of general training on the new CAD system, 8 hours of general CAD training, also each TC received 4 hours of FD specific training and 4 hours of PD specific training, The new Fire Station Alerting System (FSA) was discussed, there are some paging issues to be resolved in the next few weeks, FOIA procedural issues. Also it was reported that the new county wide CAD system is on schedule and it is planned to activate it in June.
7. Vehicle maintenance:
 - Vehicle maintenance punch list items are being created for annual preventive maintenance of all fire apparatus that will occur in July.
8. On Friday, April 12th the quarterly meeting of the Firefighter Pension Board was conducted. Elections of Officers and other normal business was conducted.
9. On Tuesday, I attended the monthly meeting of the DuPage Fire Chiefs Association. Several items were discussed at this meeting including Illinois SB37 which is proceeding through committee which will require Article 4 Fire Pension contributions from the village and our part time firefighters into the pension funds at their fulltime firefighter jobs. Naperville Fire Chief Putnitis is working to stop or diminish the effect of this proposed bill.

10. Incidents of Interest:

- Saturday, April 6th at 7:36 AM. Medic 86, Squad 86 & Hinsdale Engine 84 responded for a vehicle accident with injuries on Norfolk Ave. at Hiawatha Drive. One (1) patient transported to a local hospital.
