1. On Monday April 29<sup>th</sup> the fieldwork portion of the CY2018 Audit with Sikich LLP began, after a week of testing and examination the audit is near completion. Thursday afternoon I along with Kimberly Swiderek met with management from Sikich for the fieldwork exit conference and was informed that audit went extremely well and the Village will be receiving an Unqualified Opinion which is the highest issued opinion the auditors can issue.

I would like to extend a special thank you to Kimberly Swiderek for all her hard work which contributed to such a successful and smooth audit... I would also like to thank all of the department heads and staff here at Village Hall.

2. Wednesday morning Vehicle Sticker Sales commenced, new this year is the option to purchase a special Dancin' In The Street sticker for an additional donation. I am thrilled to report that the Dancin' In The Street sticker has been a huge hit for residents. Also new this year the village opted to send Vehicle Sticker renewal forms to each household, the envelope also stated Vehicle Information was enclosed. This change was in response to residents reporting that they didn't know when the stickers were due. Previously the renewal form was enclosed with the water bill. Many residents now receive their bills online and or have the payment directly deposited. We hope this change results in more residents purchasing their stickers prior to the due date/price increase. Stickers are valid from July 1<sup>st</sup> to June 30<sup>th</sup> so remind your neighbors to purchase their sticker before July 1<sup>st</sup>.

1. Our safety topic this week was the safe fuel handling practices.
2. It was a very rainy week for Public Works. Crews pumped out the Chestnut Street Alley on several occasions. We responded to a handful of locations that were having rainwater challenges. Due to the rain, our contractor made limited progress installing water services to the new water main.
3. A coordination meeting was held with cellular companies and emergency services to plan for the painting of the water tower on Burlington later this year. Antennas will have to be relocated to temporary poles in order for the contractor to paint the tower. This will take some time as engineers have to determine the radio frequency issues with the antennas having to transmit correctly as part of each carriers' larger network.
