Per Village Code, no person shall ride a bicycle on a sidewalk in the business district at any time.

Bikes should be walked through the downtown business district.

Crosswalk Safety

Whether you walk, bike or drive, take 5 seconds to follow crosswalk safety guidelines. You forfeit your rights as a pedestrian if you cross elsewhere. You need to make sure the road is clear in both directions and before crossing in a crosswalk. Be sure you are seen before you cross. Drivers must stop for pedestrians in a crosswalk.

Parking on Grass

Residents should be aware that parking on the grass along the streets in Clarendon Hills is not allowed. Drivers causing damaged to the grass may be held liable for the costs of repairs. Residents are responsible for informing their guests and contractors that they must park on the street, not off the street onto grass.

Street ribbons (flat concrete curbs) are part of the street. They can be driven on and parked on. They add in extending the life of the asphalt portion of the streets.

Due to our already narrow streets, garbage cans should be placed at the end of your driveway, not on the street (ribbons).

Refuse and Yard Waste Stickers

The new rate for Refuse and Yard Waste stickers is **\$2.75 per sticker**. These rates are effective 7/1/19 to 6/30/20.

Other Republic Services rates remain the same but a \$0.70 recycling fee is being added to the monthly bills starting July 1. Below are the monthly rates.

95 Gallon Weekly Can rate: \$21.98 + \$0.70 recycling fee

Senior rate \$18.98 + \$0.70 recycling fee

Back Door Can Service rate: \$33.07 + \$0.70 recycling fee

Yard Waste Tote rate: \$27.32

Required - Vehicle Stickers!

Residents are required to purchase a village sticker for each vehicle they will have housed in Clarendon Hills. The annual license period begins July 1st of each year and ends on June 30th of the next year. Stickers can be purchased starting May 1st.

New residents must obtain a Village Sticker within 30 days of moving to the Village.

Passenger Car \$40, Motorcycle \$30, and Seniors (62+) 50% off. An additional 50% late fee will be added to stickers purchased after July 31st.



New this year is the option of an alternative vehicle sticker. If a resident donates \$10 to support the Dancin' in the Street concert series, on top of a resident's vehicle sticker purchase, they will receive this unique sticker. You must hurry though because there's a limited number of these Dancin' in the Street vehicle stickers.

Vehicle Stickers can be purchased at Village Hall located at 1 N. Prospect Avenue Monday through Friday from 9am to Noon and 1pm to 5pm. They can also be purchased at the Police Station located at 448 Park Avenue, Monday through Friday from 8am to 7pm.

Watering Restrictions

Water Restrictions are enforced from May 15th - September 15th. Residents south of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on odd numbered day (1st, 3rd, 5th, etc.) Residents north of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on even numbered days (2nd, 4th, 6th, etc.)

NO WATERING IS ALLOWED BETWEEN 10 AM AND 4 PM.

Please note that watering restrictions apply to lawns, trees, shrubs and gardens only.

Permits for watering newly installed lawns and landscaping are available for a \$25.00 fee payable at the Village Hall.
