Subject: Weekly Report

1. **Purchase of Fuel for Village Vehicles** – The Village purchases fuel for our vehicles (including Fire Department vehicles) from the Village of Hinsdale. The Hinsdale pumps are temporarily off-line, and you may therefore see our vehicles fueling at area gas stations over the next few days. Just wanted to give a “heads-up” as this is not the ordinary practice.
2. **Sterigenics Update** – You may have read media accounts that Sterigenics in Willowbrook is being allowed to re-open. The agreement with the State calls for substantial improvements in the control of materials released from the site. We will continue to monitor the situation in conjunction with our neighboring communities.
3. **Strategic Planning Meeting**— As a reminder, we have a scheduled meeting to review future goals for the Village on Saturday morning, August 10th. Staff will reach out to the Board for ideas prior to the meeting.
4. **DuComm Board of Director Meeting** —Fire Chief Leahy and I attended this meeting in Wheaton on Tuesday morning. Routine business was conducted.
5. **Dancin’ in the Street Update** – After an early evening rain, the concert this past Wednesday went off without a problem. A local teenage band, the Millennials, performed and brought their local following around for the ride. Join us again on July 26 when The Sting Rays will be performing. 6. **Discussion re: 5G Implementation and Cannabis** – Community Development Director Ungerleider, Public Works Director McLaughlin and I are meeting with Hinsdale staff and an attorney from Klein, Thorpe & Jenkins on Friday afternoon to discuss the impact of 5G system implementation. The goal is to determine if our shared interests and concerns make it best to work together on this project. We also intend to discuss the response to cannabis legalization.

1. 2019 Road Program – Crews completed the concrete pours on the west side of Walker and the south side of Harris. Those residents are now able to access their driveways. Next week crews will mill a three-foot-wide trench for the new concrete ribbon and perform driveway apron removals on the east side of Walker and north side of Harris. They will also be pouring the concrete next week and residents should gain access to driveways at the end of the following week once the concrete has cured. Residents need not contact the Police for overnight parking. They are aware of the work. Residents should have their new Vehicle Stickers on display.
2. Crews responded to the rainstorms on Thursday morning. Chestnut Alley was pumped down as it stormed. Water accumulations on streets was limited. No street closures were required. Crews cleaned out inlets that were covered. Several limbs came down from parkway trees.
3. Crews replaced a valve on a water service on the 300 block of Ridge Avenue. This was done live allowing water service to remain to other homes on the main line.
4. Work began on the Burlington Avenue Water Tower Painting Project. Crews started on Friday to install a temporary cell tower to allow the removal of the equipment located on the tower.
5. Typical Summer work continued including set up and take down for Dancing in the Streets, landscape maintenance, watering Downtown planters and newly seeded areas, mowing and weeding.
6. Our Water Operator attended a roundtable meeting at the DuPage Water Commission, and I attended a demonstration of water main lining in Arlington Heights.

1. **Zoning Ordinance Modernization Project.** The Zoning Board of Appeals will be conducting a public hearing to review the draft comprehensive zoning ordinance amendment on August 15, 2019. 2. **Downtown Revitalization Project** – All documents required for the upcoming Streetscape Improvements planned for Burlington and Prospect Avenue were submitted to the Illinois Department of Transportation. Bids for construction are scheduled to be accepted and opened in late September, with an expected construction start in late November and completion by Fall 2020. 1. Fire Prevention Bureau Activity during the past week.
 - Five (5) Fire/Life Safety Inspections were conducted.
2. Training Report:
 - Tuesday, July 16th twenty one (21) firefighters attended regular fire suppression training. Hose relays, pump training and hydrant connections were practiced.
3. Emergency Medical Services Report:
 - No report.
4. Clarendon Hills/Hinsdale FD sharing of services report:
 - No report.
5. Emergency Management Report:
 - On Wednesday I attended the quarterly meeting of all DuPage County Emergency Management Coordinators in Wheaton. We discussed the updating of individual Emergency Operating Plans, Tips for exercises, State deployment to flooding and communications resources, Event ready plans, and updating of the Community profile in the CEMP.
6. Du-Comm Report:
 - On Tuesday morning I attended the quarterly meeting of the DuComm Board of Directors. The proposed new fire funding formula was discussed and will be presented to the board for a formal vote at the next meeting in October.
 - On Tuesday morning I attended the monthly meeting of the DuComm Executive Committee. At this meeting uses and possible sale or lease of the old DuComm Facility were discussed. The status of the new CAD was discussed.
 - On Thursday morning I attended the bi-monthly meeting of the DuComm Fire Chiefs Sub Committee. Several policy revisions were discussed and approved. These will now be advanced to the Police Operations Sub Committee for approval and then on to the Chiefs Committee for formal voting and approval. There was long discussions regarding the use of Mobile Data Computers and also the upcoming testing of the fire station alerting systems.
 - For the past year I have been the Vice Chair of the Chiefs (Fire and Police) Committee. Starting now and for the next year I will be the Chairman of this committee.

7. Vehicle maintenance:

- Ladder 86 has been at Wirfs Industries in McHenry for annual maintenance, minor repairs along with UL Ladder testing since July 8th. I am glad to report that Ladder 86 has passed the UL Ladder testing. Currently minor repairs are being fixed along with normal preventive maintenance. Wirfs is still waiting on a few parts to finish this. It is hoped to have this vehicle back into service next week.

8. Today, you and Peter Nickell will be meeting with me to discuss the future of the fire department. Things faced in future years will be discussed, equipment needs and staffing needs.

10. Mutual Aid Calls:

- Medic 86 responded to assist the Westmont Fire Department one (1) time.
- Squad 86 responded to assist the Westmont Fire Department three (3) times.
