1. 2019 Road Program – The project schedule had to be adjusted this week as the concrete crews were delayed on another job. As a result, removals on Prospect have been delayed. Next week crews will be focused on getting the base layer of asphalt done on Walker and Harris. Monday is targeted for base patching and Tuesday will see the base layer of asphalt go down. There will be NO PARKING on Walker or Harris due to the paving. On Wednesday and Thursday crews will be adjusting manholes. Pending crew and equipment availability, brick and asphalt driveways on Harris and Walker may be worked on. The engineer will notify residence in advance.
2. Public Works crews completed the following work:
 - a) Cleaned up dead end of Harris.
 - b) Repaired VH flagpole.
 - c) Watered flowers and trees.
 - d) Pumped tanks at Sheridan.
 - e) Repaired a water leak on an inch and one half water service line at 453 Burlington.
 - f) Repaired retaining wall adjacent to the Chestnut alley.
 - g) Set up and took down the last Dancin' in the Street concert for this year.
 - h) HVAC contractor performed temporary repairs to the Public Works air conditioning.
 - i) Met with contractor and engineers for Burlington Water Tower re-coating.
 - j) Springs were repaired on Unit #5 three ton truck.
 - k) Completed the south side hydrant exercising and flushing program.
 - l) Confirmed proper drainage and flow on the road crossing on the 200 block of Oxford.

1. Fire Prevention Bureau Activity during the past week.
 - Five (5) Fire/Life Safety Inspections were conducted.
2. Training Report:
 - Wednesday evening, twenty one (21) firefighters participated in pumping and aerial ladder operations drills.
3. Emergency Medical Services Report:

4. Clarendon Hills/Hinsdale FD sharing of services report:

6. Du-Comm Report:
 - On Monday, Lt. Dave Godek, Lt. Jim Weil and I attending a Fire Station Alerting testing session at the ETSB in Wheaton. The new Fire Station Alerting system was testing using all Clarendon Hills street names to make sure the new automated voice pronounces them correctly. A few adjustments were made. Further testing will occur over the next month before the system is turned on in late October or early November.
7. Vehicle maintenance:
 - Engine 86 was taken to Wirs in McHenry today for annual preventive maintenance and service, pump testing/certification, and for the repair of many miscellaneous problems. This vehicle is now 18 years old and requires more and more repairs each year to keep it operating. It is scheduled to be replaced in early 2022.
8. On Monday, Captain Mark Rediehs and I attended the quarterly meeting of the Village Safety Committee. Normal business was conducted.

9. Incidents of Interest:

- Friday, August 2nd at 2:53 PM. Medic 86, Squad 86, Hinsdale Engine 84 and Medic 84 responded to a vehicle accident with injuries on Rt. 83 near 55th Street.
- Friday, August 9th at 4:10 AM, 5:16 AM, 5:31 AM & 8:18 AM, Ladder 86 responded to different areas along the BNSF RR tracks from Prospect to Arthur for RR ties on fire. The fires were extinguished using small amounts of water. It appears that earlier the BNSF maintenance crews came through Clarendon Hills with their track grinders which probably caused these fires.
