Subject: Weekly Report

- Chestnut Alley Grant Application:** This process continues. A grant application as submitted to the IPEA months ago, for which we have not heard the results. The grant application to DuPage County (cover letter attached) was submitted this week. If successful we will receive about \$112,000 from the County and \$310,000 from IEPA. We will of course advise when we receive grant results. This project is included in the 2018 Budget, though the delay in this process may cause a delay.
- Meeting re: Engineering Study:** President Austin, Mike Millette, Dan Ungerleider and I met with Lee Fell from Burke Engineering to discuss a possible study of ways to alleviate flood risks in the Park Avenue and Dallas Basin areas. Lee expects to get a proposal to us within the next week or so. We would then expect to submit this proposal to the Village Board for review and approval. The plan is to evaluate ways to store more water in one or both basins and, perhaps, better ways to get the water to the basins. Though we think the results of this study could be useful, it is important to continue to stress that we have no expectation of “solving” the problems that result after the type of rain event we experienced in October.
- Water Fund Analysis:** Maureen Potempa, Peter Nickell and I are beginning to review the Water Fund to determine if it would be wise to consider bonding for upcoming capital work. We are also reviewing the existing fund balance policy to determine if we think it is still viable. This review includes meeting with our financial consultant and auditors to seek their advice. We will update the Board when information is available.
- State Required IT Security Upgrades:** The Illinois State Police began the process of putting together IT security guidelines for law enforcement agencies related to electronic police records protection. The Police Department began working with ProxIT, the Village’s IT solutions provider, to audit our current system. The process will lead to security upgrades and introduce new polices related to cyber security.
- Village Board Meeting Schedule:** As a reminder, the next Village Board meeting will be on Tuesday, January 16th, a day later than usual due to the Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday on that Monday. Please note that the Village Offices are open on Monday, January 15th.

On behalf of the Village of Clarendon Hills, I am happy to submit the attached Conceptual Design Report for financial assistance through the County's Water Quality Improvement Program. The application is for removal and replacement of an asphalt alley with porous unit paving along with installation of a bioretention rain garden.

The project addresses the sources of impairments identified in the Illinois EPA 2016 Integrated Water Quality report. These include Streambank destabilization and urban runoff.

The project is located nearly across the street from Village Hall and behind a row of commercial buildings across the street from Metra commuter parking, making the project visible and accessible to a large number of people. Further the project provides the Village an opportunity to highlight green infrastructure strategies that can be used to replace deteriorating grey infrastructure to improve water quality and reduce runoff volumes and rates.

Significant traffic and criminal activity during the period January 5, 2018 through January 11, 2018

- On January 8, 8:08am, a resident from the 100blk of Oxford came into the station to report he was victim of identity theft. The resident related that he received a past due notice from a cellular phone company that he never had an account with. Investigation continues.
- On January 9, 11:54am, officers responded to the 300blk of Harris for a burglary to motor vehicle report. The victim advised unknown subjects entered her unlocked vehicle and stole several items.
- On January 9, 2:34pm, officers responded to the 200blk of Grant for a report of burglary to motor vehicle. The victim advised unknown subjects entered her car and rummaged through it. The driver and truck were located and Public Works was called to the scene. The driver agreed to make restitution.
- On January 11, 2:50am, while patrolling the parking lot of a complex in the 200blk of N Richmond, officers located three subjects smoking cannabis in a parked car. Officers issued civil cannabis citations to the occupants and released them.
